

THE MEAT PACKAGE

These days meat is conveniently packaged to save time in the retail meat department for both the customer and the meat cutter. Extension consumer specialists at Penn State say the meat tray serves two functions — to provide rigidity to the package and to absorb fluids from the meat. Pulp trays meet both these requirements. The foam plastic tray is very popular and seems to be acceptable to both retailers and customers. However, the meat industry is looking for a package that will also provide visibility as well as rigidity and be adaptable for meats.
