with continuously operating pliances. motors. If your house normally receives 115 volts, it will receive about 104 volts-a reduction of about 8 percentduring a brownout. This amount should not cause permanent appliance damage.

Problems occur, however, because some houses, due to location at the end of a power line for instance, may not receive 115 volts under normal conditions. And when voltage goes below 100, trouble

may occur. But don't despair. There is a way to tell if the voltage in your home goes below the accepted level. Just watch tele-

vision. Under reduced voltage, the picture of a correctly operating television set will suddenly shrink. You will notice formation of a black line 1/4 to one inch wide around the screen (under extreme conditions, the line will get larger and then the picture will disappear). This does not harm the television set. But, formation is a signal to turn off the


