CONCISE FINANCIAL STATEMENT

FOR THE SCHOOL YEAR ENDED JUNE 30, 1972

We have examined the financial documents and accounting records of each of the several funds of DONEGAL SCHOOL DISTRICT, as of June 30, 1972 and for the year then ended. Our examination was made in accordance with the requirements of the School Laws of Pennsylvania and with instructions provided for conducting the audit, and accordingly included such tests of the accounting records and such other auditing procedures as we considered necessary in the circumstances.

As required by Section 2431 of the Public School Code of 1949, as amended, a report of the audit was filed September 25, 1972 in the office of the Prothonotary of the Court of Common Pleas of Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, and the said report will be confirmed absolutely unless appeal is taken therefrom within thirty days of the filing thereof.

In our opinion, the balance sheets and related statements of revenues, expenditures, and fund equities as presented below present fairly the financial position of each of the several funds of DONEGAL SCHOOL DISTRICT on June 30, 1972 and the results of their operation for the year then ended, in conformity with the principles and procedures legally established for Pennsylvania school systems.
