3	tablespoons butter
4	cups chopped, fresh
	mushrooms
2	teaspoon salt
ī	tablespoon lemon juice

3 tablespoons flour

1 $4\frac{3}{4}$ ounce can chicken spread 3 tablespoons chopped

cup sour cream

1/2 teaspoon Worcestershire sauce

Melt butter in top of double boiler, add mushrooms and cook 3 minutes. Add salt and lemon juice; cover pan and cook for another 3 minutes. Sprinkle flour over mushrooms; stir until mixture thickens. Add sour cream, chicken spread, scallions and Worcestershire sauce. Stir continuously; cook until mixture is bubbly. Turn into top of chafing dish. Let guests help themselves. Serve with small pieces of toast Makes about 3 cups.




