MUSIC NOTES

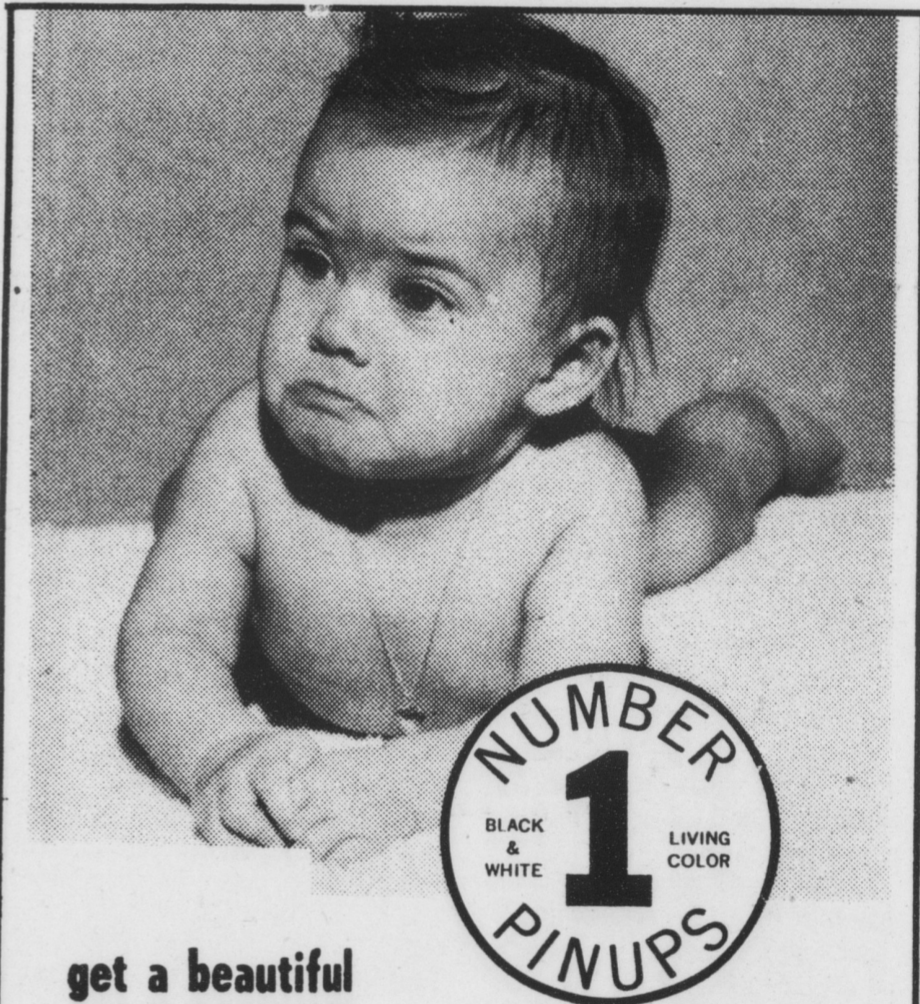
