**Time For All Yule Mail To Be On Way**

It's time for Christmas mail to be on its way, postal authorities have announced.

Airmail to any part of contiguous United States should be started by the end of this week, the postal department's recommendations for 1973 set out.

But, mail for Alaska, which is

expected to be delivered by Christmas should be started by Thursday of this week.

These dates apply both to letters and cards and to parcels.

Because of the problem of transportation which are troubling everyone, the post office department too is facing some of the same difficulties and early mailing is virtually imperative, administrators point out.
