## Over The Back Fence

At a recent Farm-City Week meeting the past editor of the Farm Journal magazine, Carroll Streeter, gave one of the most informative presentations on today's agricultural conditions that I've heard in recent years. This world-wide journalist held the attention of his audience far beyond his scheduled time and they wanted more. He told us of the food production capacity of this country and of the many advances farmers have made in the past several decades. Also, the period of surpluses is over and now there is great demand for nearly all food, fiber, and feed products. The aim is "all-out" production in almost every commodity. He summarized his talk by saying that he had no doubt that the American farmer could meet the increased demand, providing the rest of us would let him do it. To impose unreasonable pesticide and environmental restrictions on the farmer could result in higher costs and food shortages. Give the farmer a chance to produce the most important item in the world today -- FOOD.

The holiday season is approaching and Christmas trees will soon be on the market. I hear remarks that the cutting of evergreen trees for Christmas is not a good ecology move because trees should be allowed to grow. There is nothing to surpass the beauty and natural odor of a real Christmas tree in the home or office during the holiday season; each year about 35 million trees are cut in this country for this special time; this is in comparison with the 85 billion trees that are planted each spring; most tree farmers try to plant two trees for every tree cut the previous year. Therefore, don't feel badly because the trees are cut; they are grown for this purpose and should be enjoyed by all.

Strawberry growers should be prepared to mulch their berries as soon as the ground begins to freeze; this usually happens early in December. A 3 to 4 inch layer of straw or

hay over the berries will protect them from wintry winds and keep the ground from freezing and thawing; this alternate warm and cold ground will cause heaving of the plants to the point where their roots will be exposed next spring. If chopped cornstalks, ground corncobs, or sawdust is used, only a 2-inch layer should be applied. Leaves should not be used because they pack too tightly. Now is the time to give some attention to the strawberry plants for a bigger crop next June.

Colder weather is due and snow cover may mean that rabbits will find the tender bark of trees and shrubs very appetizing. Property owners are urged to wrap their trees with heavy paper, aluminum foil, or hardware cloth to a height of at least 24 inches. I have seen rabbits completely girdle small crabapple and euonymous trees when snow remained on the ground any length of time; severe feeding can kill trees and shrubs. We urge owners to wrap these trees and shrubs before the snows come.

### NOTICE TO THE RESIDENTS OF LANCASTER COUNTY, PA. RETURNS OF PERSONAL PROPERTY For the Calendar Year Ending December 31, 1973

Subject to Taxation for County Purposes At the Rate of Four Mills on the Dollar PAYABLE DURING THE YEAR 1974

UNDER the Provisions of the Act of June 17, 1913 and The Supplement and Amendments Thereto.

Every resident, individual, copartnership, company or corporation in the City and County of Lancaster holding Personal Property taxable under the Act of June 17, 1913, P.L. 507 and amendments is required by law to file a return thereof to the Lancaster County Personal Property Tax Bureau, stating the market value thereof as of December 31, 1973. Returns to be made between January 2, 1974 and February 15, 1974. Blank forms for Returns have been mailed, and if you did not receive a blank return, one may be obtained at the office of the Lancaster County Personal Property Tax Bureau, 45-47 N. Duke St., Lancaster, Pa.

**PENALTY: FAILURE TO FILE RETURN ON OR BEFORE FEBRUARY 15, 1974, THE PERSONAL PROPERTY TAX BUREAU WILL ENTER AGAINST YOU AN ESTIMATED ASSESSMENT, TO WHICH WILL BE ADDED A PENALTY OF 12 PERCENT.**

Following is a partial list of Personal Property Subject to tax; Mortgages, Promissory Notes or Bonds of individuals; Judgments; Public Loans or Bonds (not exempted); Bonds, Notes, etc., issued by Corporations (not exempted); Bonds, etc. of Corporations of First Class; Shares of Stock, etc., Article of Agreement, (which bear interest) Mortgages; Judgment Notes or Promissory Notes between members of the family are taxable.

If there is any doubt as to the taxability of securities held, consult your lawyer, banker or broker. Assistance in preparing forms is available at the Lancaster County Personal Property Tax Bureau, Lancaster, Penna.
