## Grover Gouker To Speak To Chamber Of Commerce

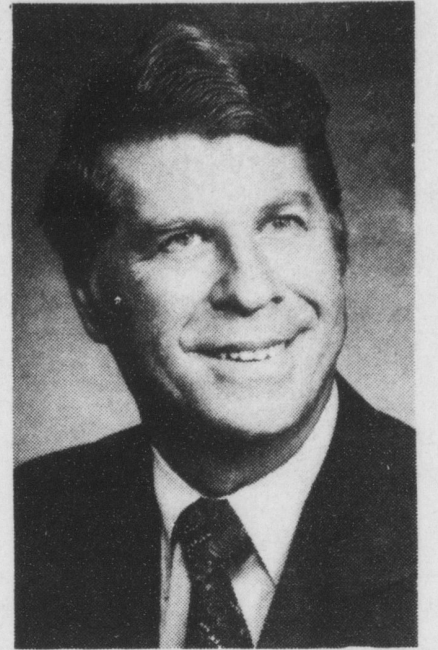

speaker, he has averaged 200 addresses per year since 1957.

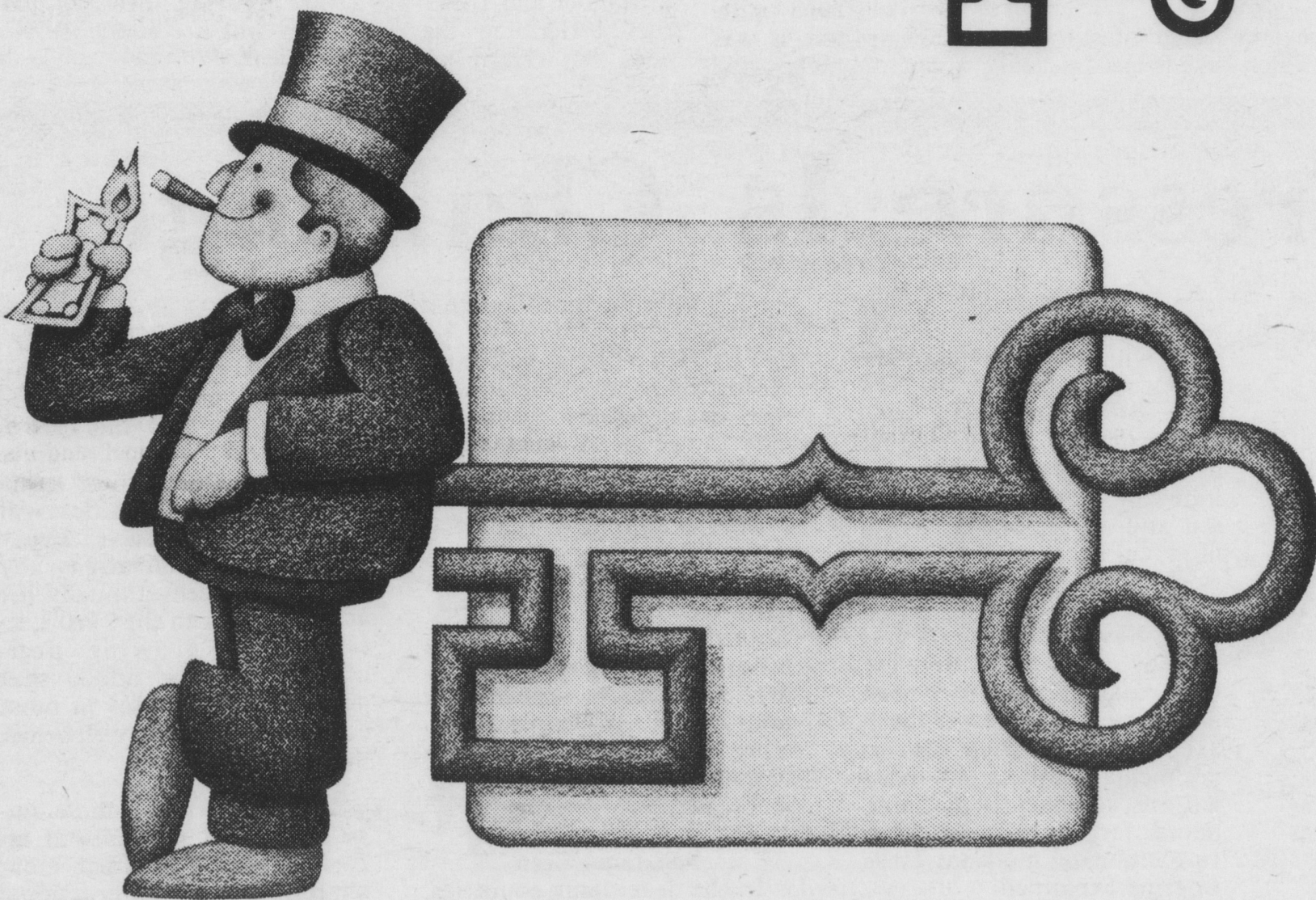
