(We are reminded of the Christmas Eve, 1968, when an Apollo crew circled the moon and quoted a selection from Genesis, causing some controversy.)

We ask ourselves a question: Has man become so obsessed with technology, with material, that he becomes immune to the deep spiritual cravings within himself? Irwin admits that NASA is plagued with a certain uneasiness when questions are raised con-

cerning the emotional or spiritual impact upon the astronauts. Their primary concern, necessarily, is that of a technical nature; however, as a result, little or no psychological preparation is given that will help the astronauts deal with newly-experienced psychological phenomena. Irwin mentions the fact that a fellow astronaut, "Buzz" Aldrin, experienced an emotional breakdown upon his return to earth!

Today, Jim Irwin is the president of the High Flight Foundation. He has retired from the Air Force in order to travel and help to raise the spiritual consciousness of those the world around. His message is definitely unique. He feels a responsibility to be a representative-and because of his experience, he is able to witness in a uniquely effective manner.

We hope that Jim Irwin may be blessed through the sharing of his spiritual insight, and that many may be awakened to a new spiritual awareness by his ministry.

These will be on display in the high school gymnasium. In addition to being awarded ribbons or trophies, outstanding projects selected by the science fair committee will be entered in the Lancaster City County Science and Engineering Fair at Conestoga Valley High School on April 3, 4 and 5.
