Services were held Monday April 8, with full military honors and interment in Restland Memorial Park, Dallas.

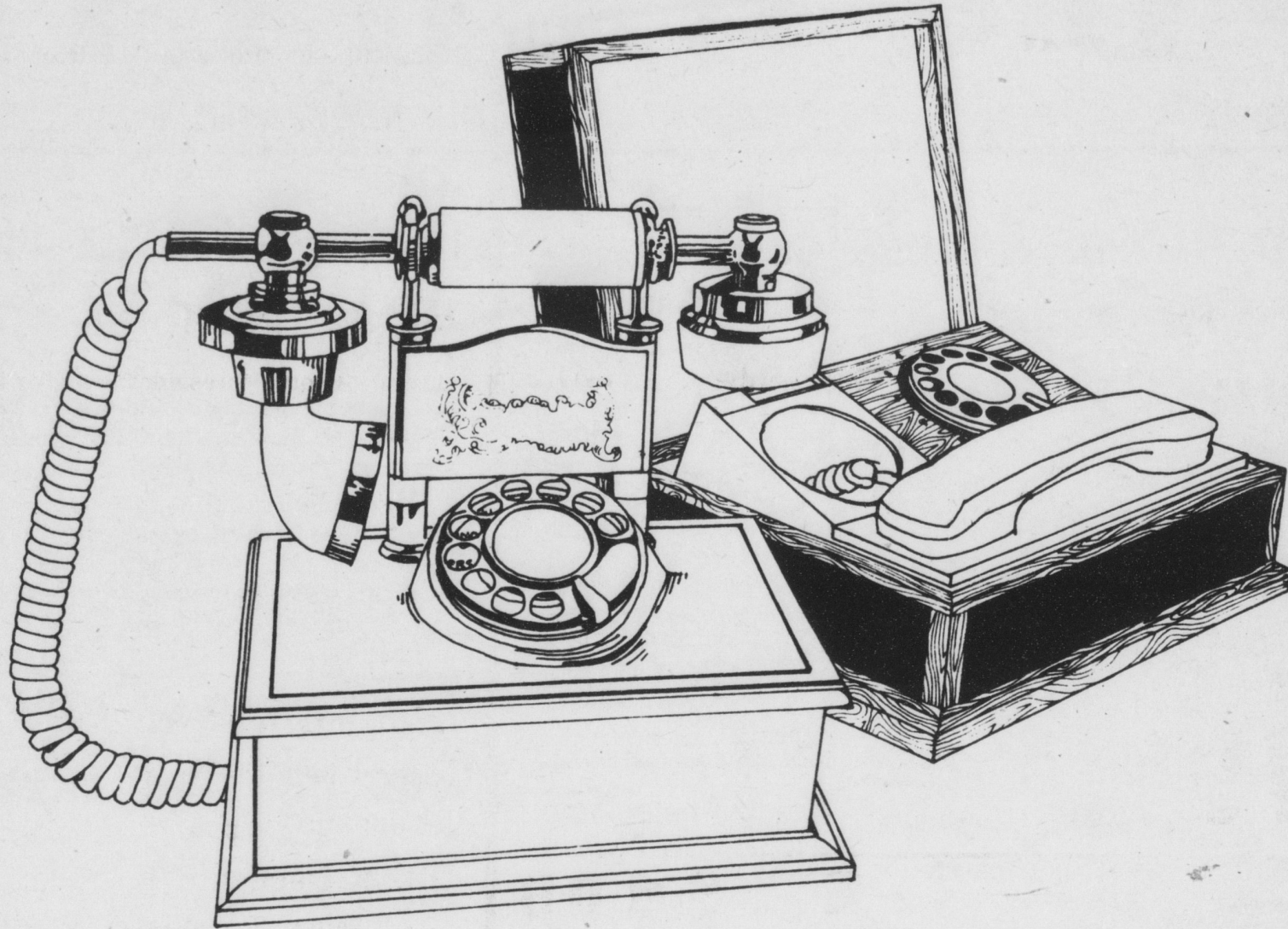
### On Tennis Squad

### Reports For Duty

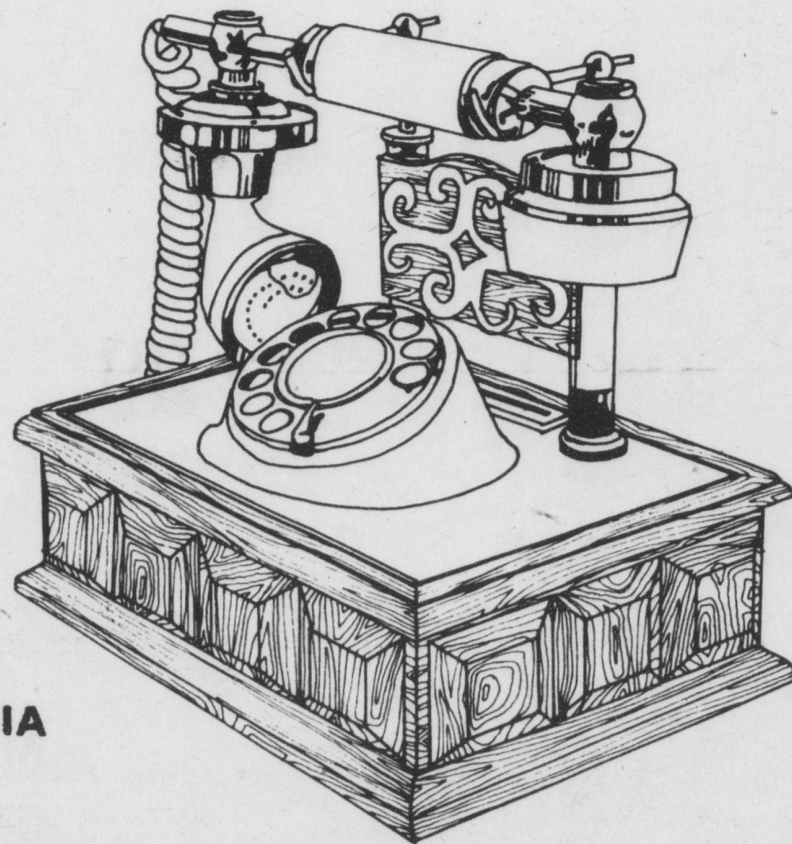
