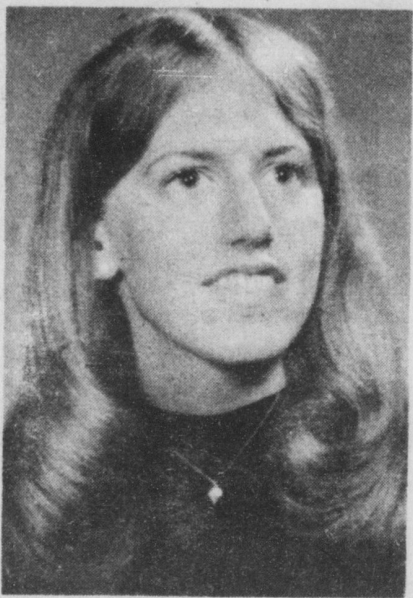


Boy and Girl of Month

She will enter the licensed practical nursing program at the Willow Street Vo-Tech School following graduation from Donegal.

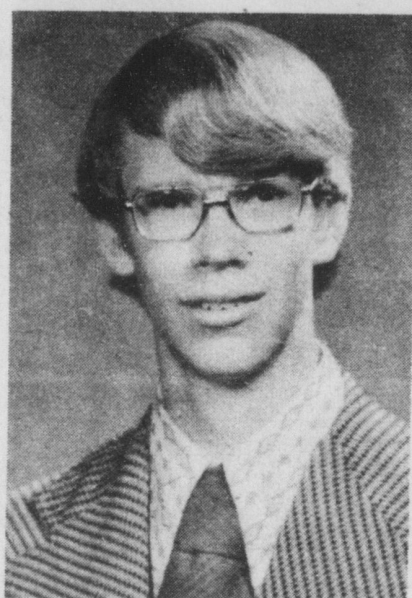
Parker Competes With Rifle Company

Show N-C Earnings At Record High

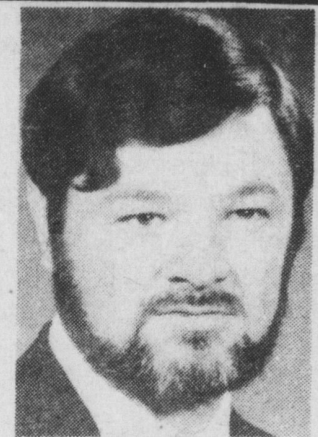
Record earnings from regular operations and a non-recurring gain of 50 cents per share raised National-Standard company earnings to \$1.07 for the quarter ended March 31, according to N-S Chairman T. H. Pearce. The previous year's earnings were 40 cents per share for the comparable period.

For the six months, earnings were \$1.66 per share, including non-recurring gains of 62 cents, versus 77 cents a year ago. Sales volume for the six months was a record \$101 million, an increase of 15 per cent over \$88 million in 1973.

Sales volume in the second quarter was a record \$54.3 million, 14 per cent higher than the \$47.6 million quarter in 1973.

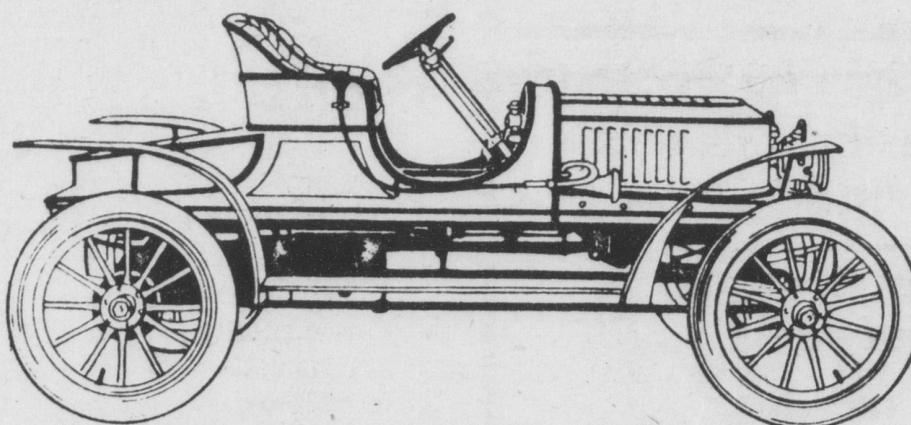
The annual June Social is being planned for dinner and a play at Mt. Gretna. Club members will decide whether to make it a "Couples Night" or for "Ladies Only".

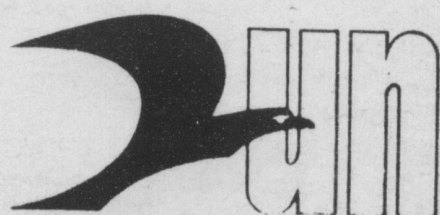
