THE WONDER OF BOOKS

Perhaps some readers are familiar with "Melmark," a home for mentally handicapped children located in the Philadelphia area. "Melissa Comes Home" is Mildred Krentel's story of the founding of that home and her family, whose courage made such a dream possible.

Krentel tells of the birth of her daughter, Melissa, who has Down's Syndrome, otherwise known as Mongoloidism. However, the unexpected happened when the teenage members of the Krentel family demanded that Melissa come home for a Christmas vacation. Soon she had captivated the hearts of her entire family and was home to stay!

Part of the joy of this book lies in the fact that the reader gains a much-valued appreciation for handicapped children. Too often, the retarded child is shunned and ignored because of our ignorance. Their capacities are underestimated and they are treated and thought of as almost sub-human. Mildred Krentel gives us a fresh approach to this type of child. She challenges us to love and to respond. Through her, we can believe that there is great joy and satisfaction associated with helping such children.

Mildred Krentel is a warm, sensitive, Christian woman. Much of her life has been dedicated to service in the church. In her work at "Melmark" she has continued to teach the Christian

"Melissa Comes Home" is a story of two parallel struggles - the Krentel's struggle in dealing with a difficult problem, and Melissa's struggle in life as a handicapped child. The two are parallel. Yet, so much are they entwined that they are inseparable. As is oftentimes the case, through struggles, we become stronger. "Melissa Comes Home" involves the reader in a struggle. We, too, become stronger.


