Radio For Blind Subject Of Talk For **BPW** Club





P.P. & L. Dividend **Moves Up 2 Cents**

An increase in the quarterly dividend rate to 45 cents per share, from 42 cents per share, on its common stock has been announced by Pennsylvania Power & Light Company's board of directors. The higher dividend, which will be payable on July 1, to shareowners of record June 10, is the first increase by the company since 1972.
