

"Child Abuse" Is Topic At Joyce-ettes' Meeting

Stephen Sohony was the guest speaker at the recent meeting of the Mount Joy Joyce-ettes.

He urged the women present to become more aware and involved concerning the abused child. He related instances of child abuse which are reported daily at the Bureau of Children's Services in Lancaster. Abuse is not limited to physical treatment, but also includes mental cruelty, he said.

One suggestion that Sohony made to curb abuse is to try to teach young people how to effectively be good parents. He suggested that other skills are taught in school to prepare young people for married life, but seldom are skills taught for becoming effective parents. Sohony also emphasized the need for more legal protection for children. The rights of children are often ignored by the courts, he said, and parents who abuse

their children are seldom reprimanded sternly enough.

The speaker urged those present to report any cases of suspected child abuse to the Bureau of Children's Services. All reports are carefully checked out by caseworkers, he said.

Following a discussion period, the Joyce-ette meeting was held. Reports were made from the following chairmen: community council, Messiah home, Brownies, and membership.

Projects reviewed were the April hoagie sale, the trophies and scholarships for Donegal high school seniors, the Princess Pageant, a bake sale and the Jaycee carnival.

A summer picnic is being planned to include the children at the Messiah Home. Chairmen were selected to take the treats to the playground at the end of the summer. The membership voted to combine the county social in October with the area meeting of the State Jayceetes. Chairmen also were appointed to select a location for the September dinner meeting.

After lengthy discussion, a budget was corrected and adopted for 1974-'75.

The next membership meeting will be a covered dish picnic on June 18.
