ORDINANCE NO. 363 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 334 ENACTED JUNE 8, 1970 TO PROVIDE FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF ADDITIONAL ONE-WAY STREETS WITHIN THE BOROUGH OF MOUNT JOY.

BE IT ORDAINED AND ENACTED by Borough Council of the Borough of Mount Joy, Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, and it is hereby ordained and enacted as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 4. of Article II of Ordinance No. 334, enacted June 8, 1970, is hereby amended by adding the following three (3) streets which are hereby established as one-way streets:

Street	From	To	Direction of Vehicular Travel
7. Coal Alley	E. Main Street	Apple Tree Alley	Northbound
8. Patterson Alley			Southbound
9. Apple Alley	W. Main Street	Clay Alley	Southbound

SECTION 2. In all other respects Article II, Section 4. of Ordinance No. 334, enacted June 8, 1970 shall remain the

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall become effective on July 1, 1974.
