WORKMEN PUT DOWN first of three layers of the surface for Donegal high school's new \$100,000 running track, located immediately north of the present baseball field. Final surfacing — a special, resilient material — may be laid later this week.

Construction of Donegal of a \$7,880 chain link fence is high school's new running track — a \$100,000 project is going through a critical stage this week with a possibility that the final surfacing may be done by Saturday.

Early this week, the first of three layers of the track surfaces (course macadam) had been paid and rolled into place. Later a second coating will be applied and finally a special type layer will be put down.

The running surface - the third laver, called reslite will provide the finished surface for the quarter-mile track.

progressing. The entire area will be encircled, joining the present baseball field fence, which will form the south side of the track site.

At a recent meeting of the School Board, authorization was given for construction of run-ways and jumping pits, located inside the oval. Specifications were omitted from the original bidding. Cost is to be \$4,756.

The entire area was rough graded several months ago. Following completion of

construction activities, the area, both inside and outside the aval, will be seeded.
