More than 1500 garments were collected for the annual ingathering of the Mount Joy Charter Needlework Guild of America, held at St. Mark's United Methodist Church.

Mrs. Simeon Horton was elected president and Mrs. Vera Newcomer, secretary. Mrs. Ken Gainer was named assistant secretary and Mrs. Adam Greer and Mrs. Melvin Weaver were re-elected vice-president and

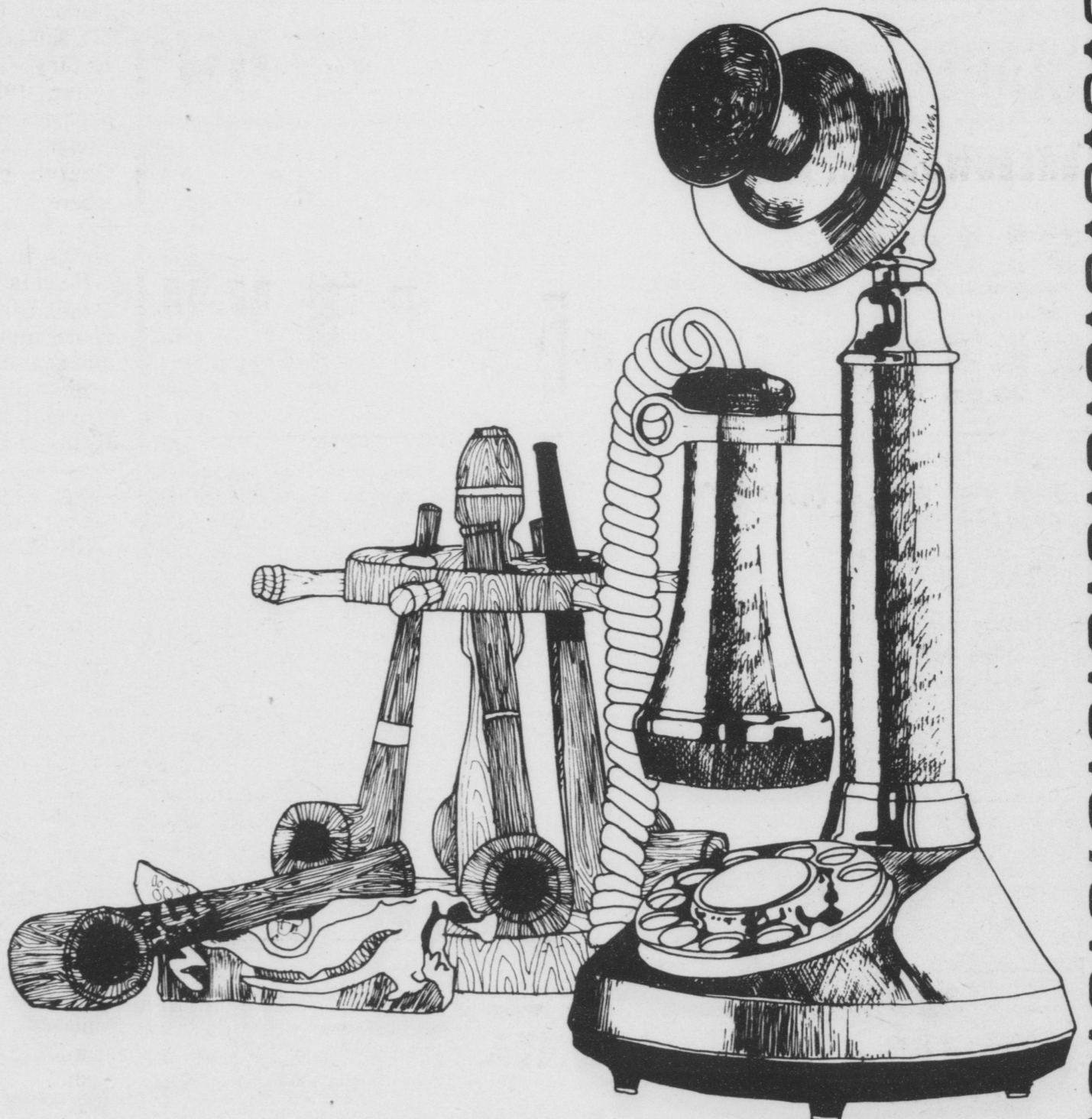
