Funeral services for Mrs. Marianne Walther Gingrich, 43, who died Thursday, Nov. 21, were held last weekend at the convenience of the family and burial was made in the Mount Joy cemetery. Mrs. Gingrich, wife of Jay Nissley Gingrich, died at 3:45 a.m. at the General hospital, where she was admitted two days earlier following a fall at her home, "The Springs", south of the borough on Longenecker Road.

Investigation following the death indicated that Mrs. Gingrich made her way back into the home and to a second floor bedroom, from where she telephoned a neighbor, who summoned the ambulance.

A graduate of Sullins Junior College, Bristol, Va., and Pennsylvania State university, Mrs. Gingrich was a member of Society of Colonial Clergy and Daughters of American Colonists.

She was a direct descendant of Jacob Landis, whose grandson settled Landis Valley.


