No Action Despite Worries Concerning Emergency Lights

Despite worried words of concern about a continuing touchy emergency lighting problem in Friendship Fire company's second-floor assembly hall, Mount Joy Borough Council took no action Monday night.

Councilmen raised words of deep concern about the lighting system which is called "inadequate."

Responsibility and insurance of the borough in case of disaster were discussed with regard to regular use of the hall each Wednesday night by as many as 100 people.

The system in question is required to give adequate lighting in case the normal power supply fails.

One councilman said that the system is no worse than it has been for several years. An item in the 1975 budget is

designed to provide funds to remedy the situation, he added.
