There has been seasonal increase of mailings and of receipts, but not in the volume anticipated.

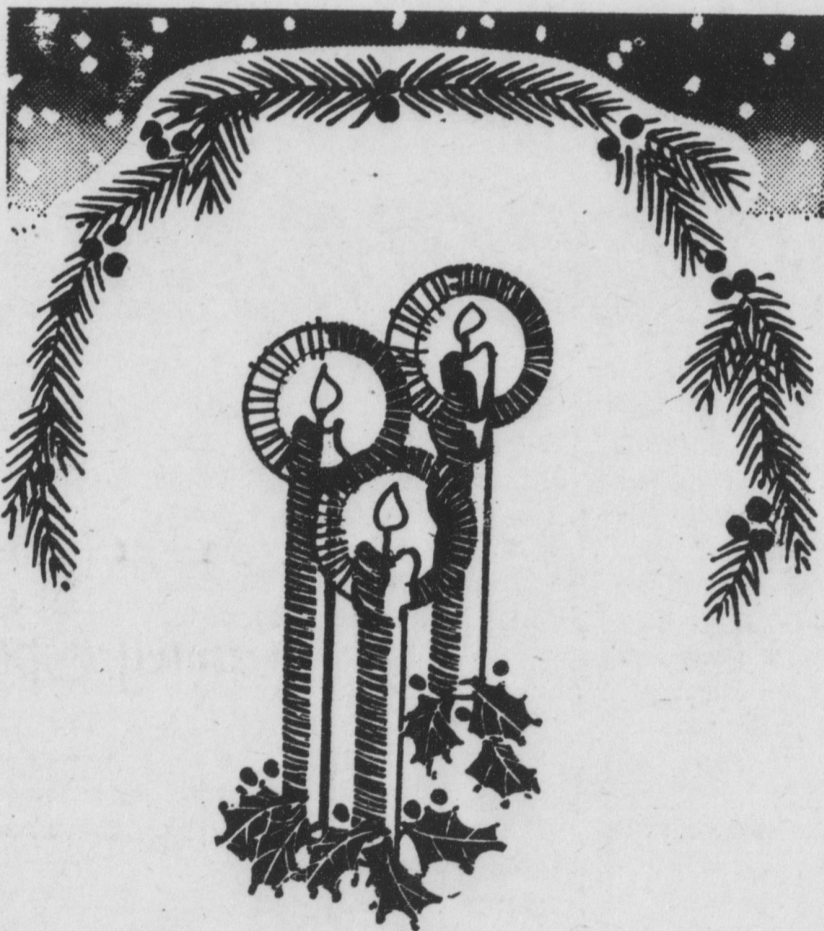
In the meantime, the local office is "braced" and ready if a last minute rush does develop and will make every effort to deliver the load.

In other years, Monday morning of this week would have seen a very heavy crush of mail as people finished their "card lists" on Sunday and handed their messages to the post office for delivery.

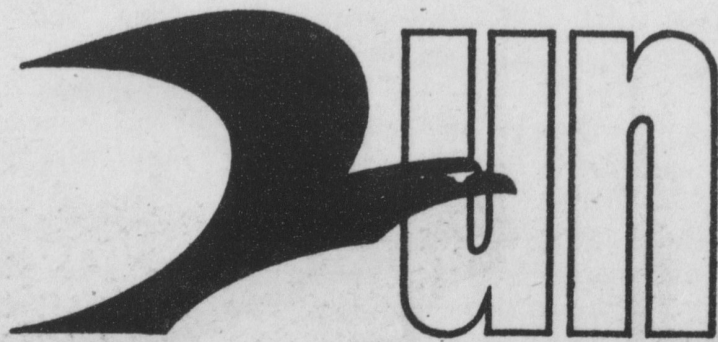
Easy Test
