women help fire victims

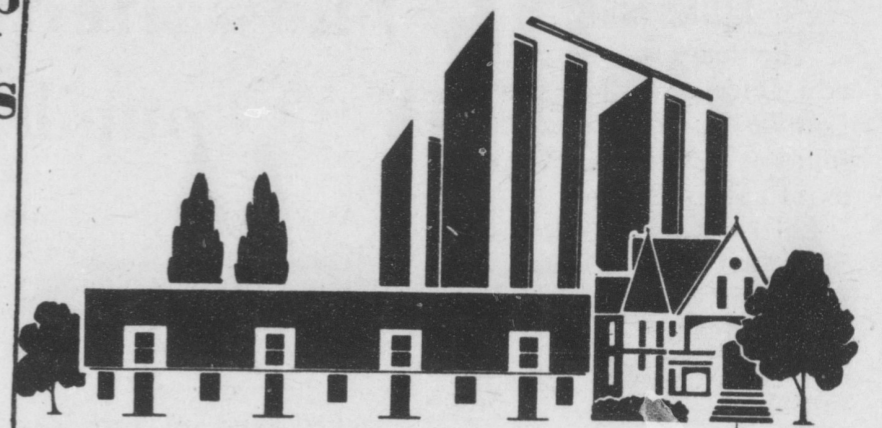

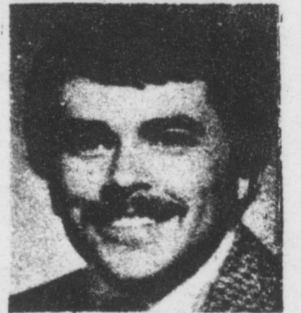

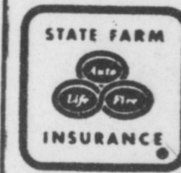

"Cabaret" will run January 24 through February 4 at 8 p.m. in the York Little Theatre.

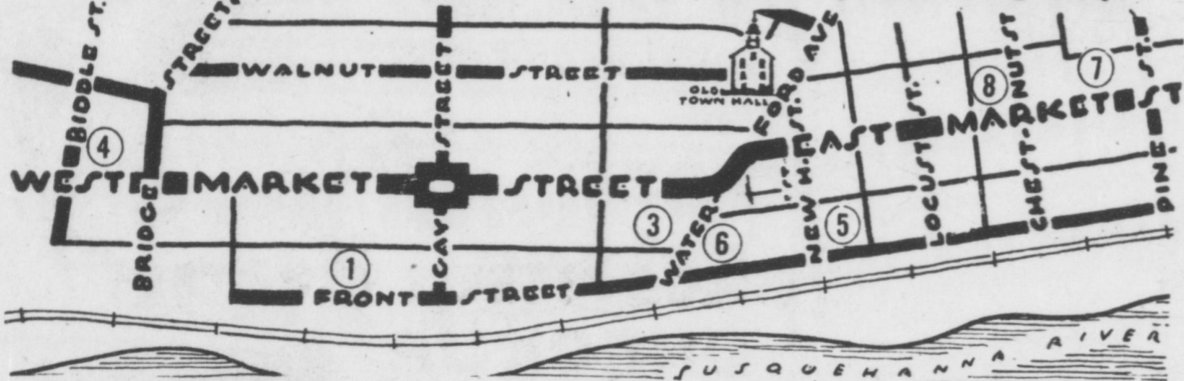
