

Scouts at Jan. camp bare ground. As they make their trek, the competing patrols are given problems that can be solved by using a variety of scouting or woodlands skills-such as map and compass reading, first aid, and the techniques of crossing rough terrain.

Donald W. Peters, Columbia, is chairman of the 1975 Frozen Trail event. Arthur C. Lord, Lancaster, is program chairman for the Western District. Also assisting with arrangements are Robert M. Rogers, East Petersburg, Western District chairman for Scouting, and Clayton Garrett, Jr., Manheim, district scout executive.

Scouts and leaders who participate in the 1975 Operation Frozen Trail will receive specially designed patches to wear on their uniforms. They can earn "Polar bear hero" strips to wear with the patches by camping out at Mack Scout Reservation on Friday night, January 17, then taking part in the competition the following day.

The 1974 Frozen Trail competition was won by the Viking patrol of Troop 129, Rohrerstown.
