
Mrs. Forry was burned most severely. At latest reports from St. Joseph's Hospital in Lancaster, she had been transferred to Hershey Medical Center for treat-

The couple have two children aged six and three.




Instead of showing Scott's picture, we inserted a picture of Dave Presto among the candidates for Sir Valentine.
