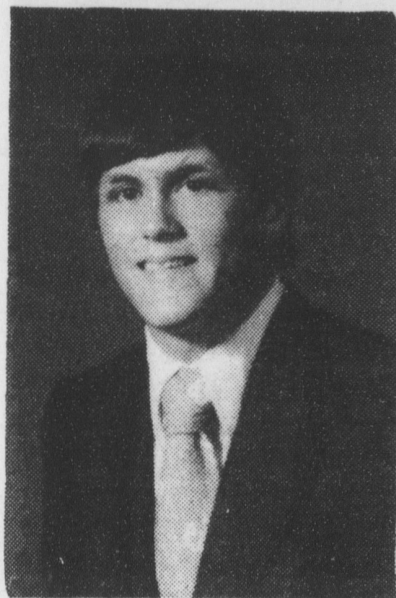


## Mull, Sheetz, girl & boy of month

## F&M accepts Jones, Peifer

Each of the girls are one of 80 high school seniors who were offered early decision admission to the co-educational liberal arts college.

Under the early decision program, an applicant states that Franklin and Marshall is his first choice among

colleges, and that if admitted, he will definitely attend.

Early decision applicants must complete their credentials by December 1, and are told of the Admissions Committee's decision two weeks later. Regular applicants file their credentials by February 15, and are notified that they have been accepted or denied admission on or about April 1.

In all, Franklin and Marshall plans to admit a freshman class of 540 students in September. The College's total enrollment is 1,975 students.

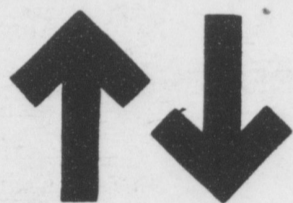

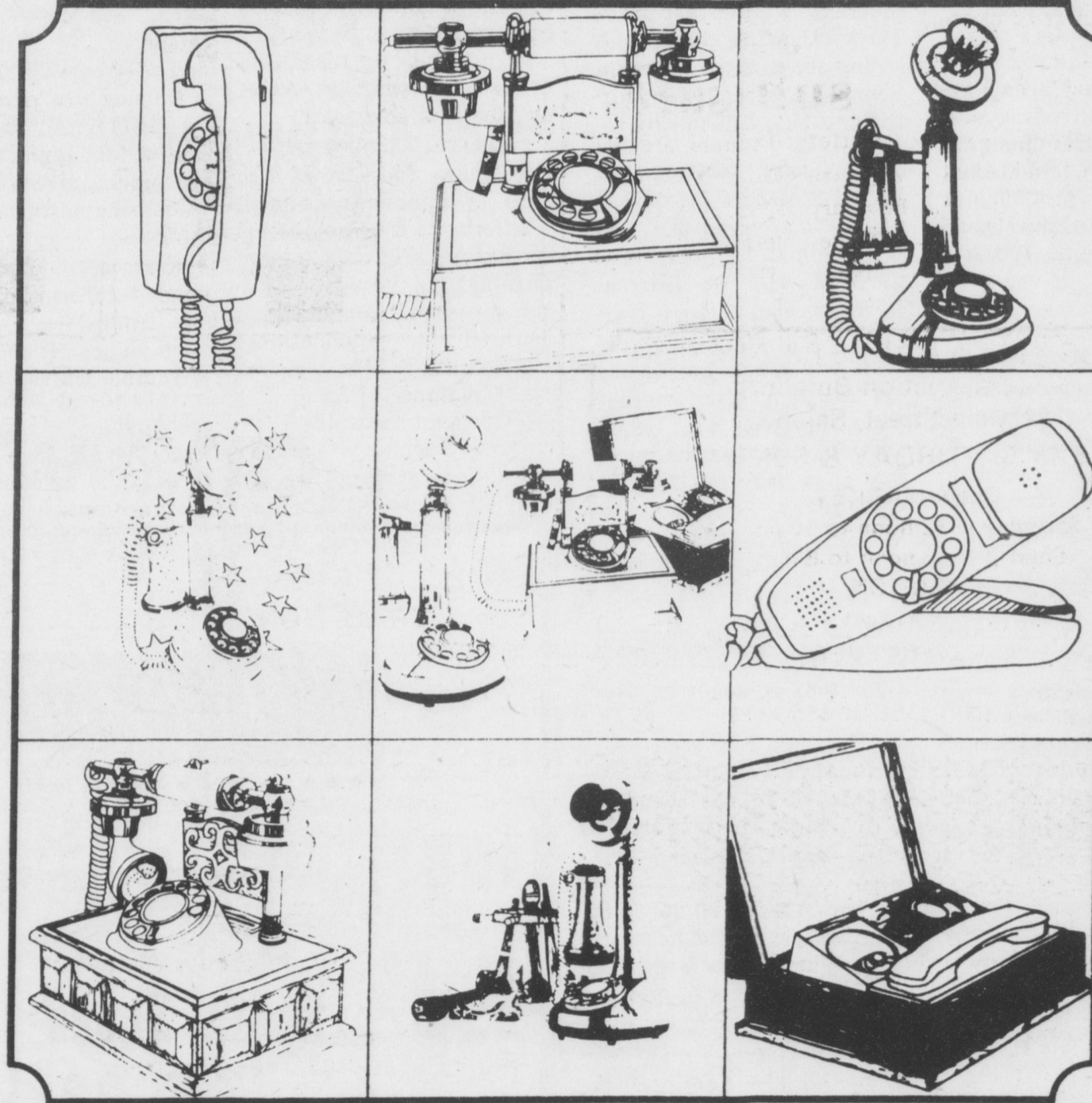
