"YOU AND YOUR PRESCHOOLER"

"You and Your Preschooler" will be the subject of a meeting for Lancaster County parents to be held at St. Peter's Lutheran Church on April 3, 1975 from 6:45 to 10:00 p.m. and again on April 4, 1975 from 8:45 a.m. to 12:00 noon.

The session sponsored and conducted by the Lancaster County Penn State Cooperative Extension Service, will include a general session on disciplining the preschooler, presented by James VanHorn, Family Living Specialist at The Pennsylvania State University. Participants will then select two of four workshops offered: how to develop creativity in the preschooler; how to select preschool Educational programs; managing with a junior consumer; children and television.

Discussion sessions include "learn by doing" activities for parents. In addition, educational exhibits relating to preschoolers will be on display and handout material will be available from local service agencies.

Anne Hinkel, Extension Home Economist, Lancaster County, says that the preschool years are the important ones in setting the stage for a child's future learning. She urges county parents of preschoolers to attend this program. For those parents wishing to bring their small children, a nursery and babysitting service will be provided at the meeting location for 30 children at the cost of \$1.00 per child. Babysitting services must be confirmed by phone because of the limited space available.

Get sticker

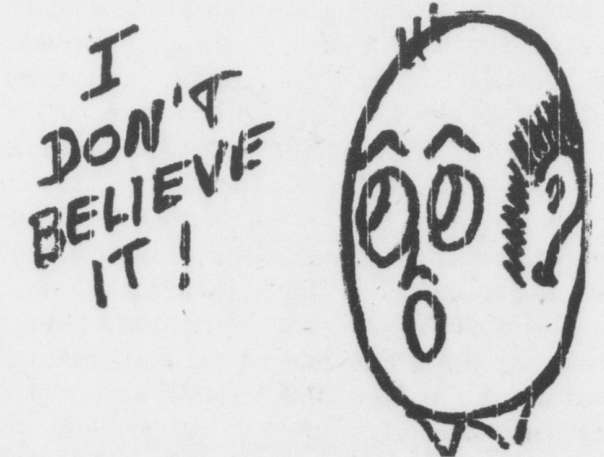
Pennsylvania motorists who attempt to drive vehicles bearing 1974 registration stickers after March 31 stand a serious chance of running afoul of the law.

The penalty for using an expired registration is a \$10 fine plus costs or five days in jail.

Last April a total of 2,056 drivers were arrested for improper registration.

That figure for one month is one-third of the total year's arrests for improper registration in 1974, and for the most part it represents drivers who just waited too long to apply for their 1974 license stickers but continued to drive their cars on the old tags.
