The Maytown Fire Company is selling steaks and subs at the fire hall this Saturday, April 26, from 9 a.m. till 5 p.m.

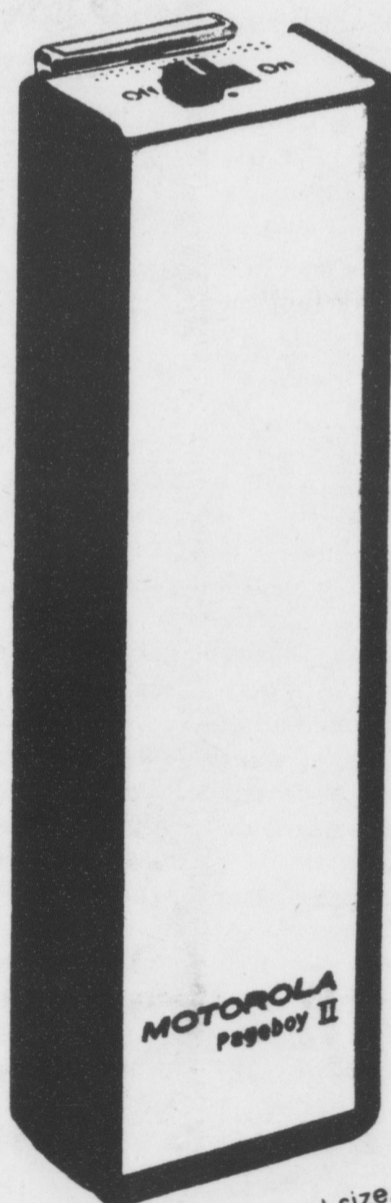
On May 11 the company will offer a family style roast beef dinner from 11 a.m. on.
