## GIRLS BOW TO McCASKEY

Although the girls' track team was tripped up in its meet with McCaskey, many fine performances were recorded, particularly by Marcia Weidman who set a new school record for the shotput with a throw of 34 feet, 7 inches, and by Pam Kolp who threw the javelin a shattering 102 feet, 6 inches for a new school record and the second best throw in the county.

Sue Meszaros placed 3rd in the 100 yard dash and 2nd in the 220 yard dash.

In the 440 yard dash, Helene Dalkiewicz took first with Barb Landis placing second and Norma Heisey just missing the sweep for Donegal.

Joan deVitry captured 2nd in the 880 yard run after finishing similarly in the 1 mile run. Also in the mile, Jolene Ellis placed third setting a new personal best.

The 80 yard hurdle race was won by Pat Brown, who nipped her opponent at the tape.

The 880 yard sprint medley, which consists of two 110 yard dashes followed by a 220 and a 440 yard dash, was won by the team of Sue Meszaros, Helen DeJesus, Reanne Parker, and Helene Dalkiewicz.

Donna Ebersole captured 2nd place in the high jump clearing a height of 4 feet, 10 inches. Lois Raber placed third in the long jump, the

final event of the day. By far, the highlight of the day was the disputed disqualification of both teams in the 880 yard relay, which caused a delay of the meet and left the Indians short 5 points.

Again, congratulations to Marica and Pam, and, also to Joan deVitry who set the record for the girls' mile run in a previous meet and Phil Mitzkavich, who set the boys' mile run record in the meet with Cocalico last Thursday.


Proceeds from the benefit will be used to underwrite the cost of summer playground activities held at Memorial Park.
