Will bridge be named "Wright's Ferry?"

Rep. Kenneth E. Brandt, R-Lancaster, announced his legislation (HB 290) to name the bridge over the Susquehanna River on U.S. Route 30 the Wright's Ferry Bridge, has passed the House and is now in the Senate for study and passage.

Brandt explained that this span links Columbia, Lancaster County and Wrightsville, York County on Route 30, and he has received a tremendous response from the residents of the Columbia area, supporting his proposal to name the bridge the Wright's Ferry Bridge.

He said he has also had many letters from local constitutents in Lancaster and York Counties in favor of "Other this suggestion.

names have been suggested, but I believe that since Wright is such an historic family name in the area, it is only right that the bridge be so named."

Brandt also pointed out that where this bridge has been built, originally the Wright's Ferry plied the river transporting people from one side to the other.

"I believe the naming of this bridge in honor of the Wright family, the original land granters in the area, will be a noteworthy event in commemorating the Bicentennial in both Counties," Brandt said.

"I am pleased the legislation has received the approval of the House and I look forward to Senate approval in the near future."


