

All participants must be present at the Mount Joy Tennis Courts at the starting time on Saturday at 10 A.M. for final entry qualifications.

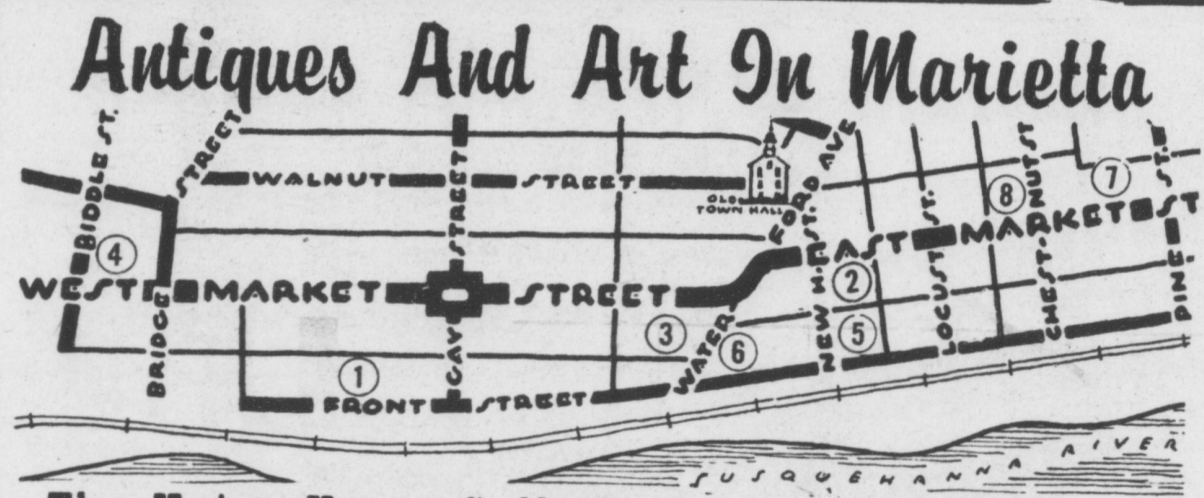
There will be a small entry fee, and prizes will be awarded to the finalists.
