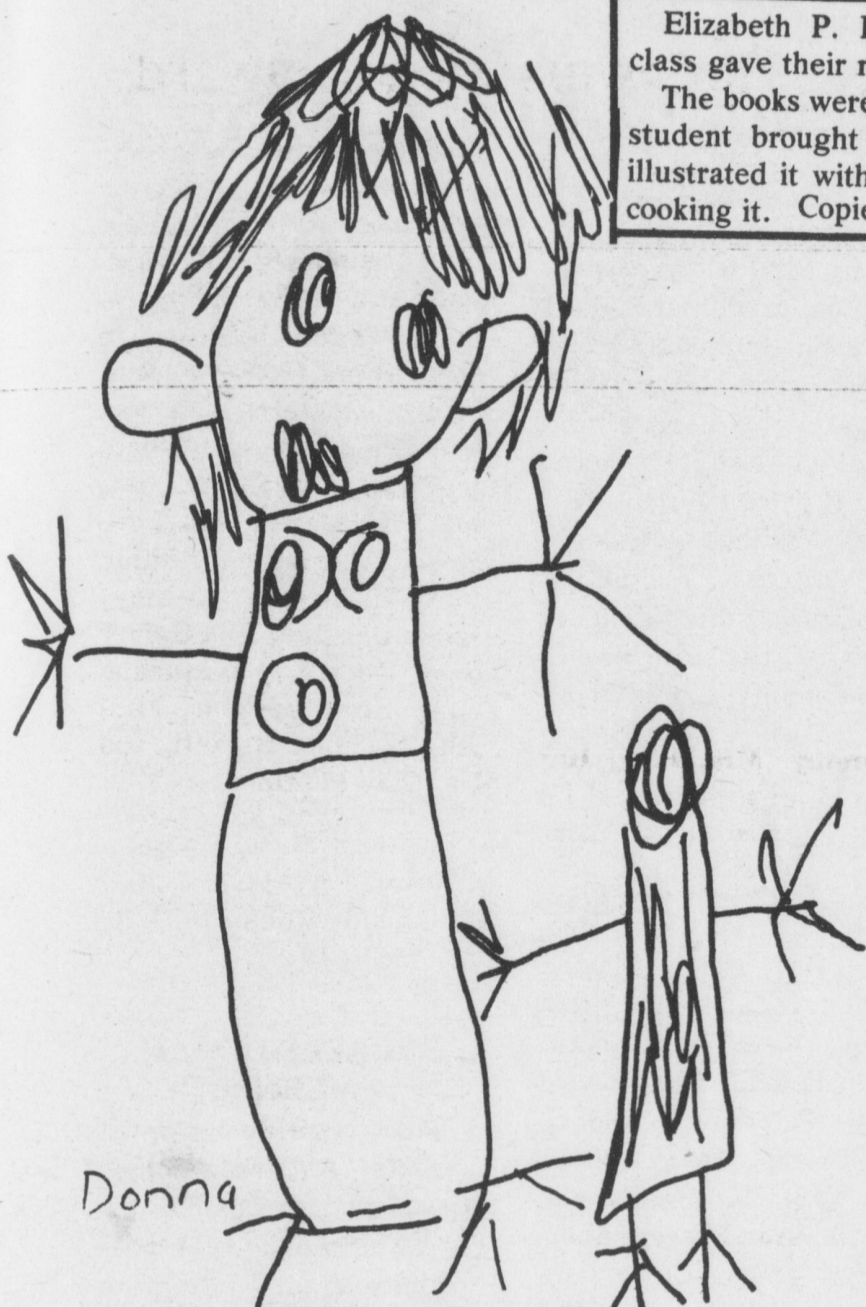


KINDERGARTEN COOKBOOKS

SWEET-SOUR LENTILS

from the kitchen of Mrs. Pekarek

- 1 lb. pkg. lentils
- 4-6 cups water
- 1 tsp. salt
- 4 T. vinegar
- 4 T. sugar

Wash lentils thoroughly; then drain. Cover with 4 - 6 cups water and the salt. Bring to boiling point, reduce heat and simmer (do not boil) slowly until tender, about two hours. If it gets too thick while cooking, keep adding a little water. When done add the vinegar and sugar. Be sure to stir the lentils to distribute the sweet-sour taste. Serve with frankfurters.

SPICE CAKE

- 2 eggs
- 3/4 c. milk
- 1 t. vanilla
- 2 T. molasses
- 1/2 t. each of cinnamon, cloves, allspice
- 1 1/4 c. shortening
- 1 1/4 c. sugar
- 2 c. flour
- 2 t. baking powder
- 3/4 t. salt

Combine shortening, molasses, and vanilla. Add dry ingredients and milk. Beat for 2 min. Add eggs and beat for 3 min. Bake at 375 degrees for about 30 to 35 min. in a loaf pan.

ICE CREAM DELIGHT

- 60 Ritz crackers
- 1/4 lb. butter
- 1 1/2 c. milk
- 1/2 gal. vanilla ice cream (softened)
- 2 sm. packs coconut cream instant pudding
- 9 oz. Cool Whip

Crush crackers. (Reserve some for topping.) Melt butter and pour over crackers in a 9" x 13" pan. Press on bottom only. Pour milk into softened ice cream and beat with mixer until smooth. Add instant pudding and heat again. Pour over crackers and add Cool Whip on top. Top with left-over crackers. Refrigerate and serve!
