The steamboat 'Accomac' was built prior to World War 1 and met its fate by fire in the late 1920's. The last pilot of the boat was William Walker (the late) and the conveyance was built by a resident of Middletown.

Moonlight parties were sometimes held on the boat and after dinner at Accomac Inn, which owned the steamboat, a cruise to Harrisburg was enjoyed by those engaging the vessel. The boat shuttled between Marietta and Accomac on weekends and holidays on a regular schedule and was removed from the water onto a rack for the winter months.

This photo was loaned by William Smith of Maytown who stated he and his brother were escorted by their father, walked from Marietta, boarded the 'Accomac', rode to Accomac, climbed to the house at the top and then retraced their steps to return home from their trip at the end of a happy Sunday.

In 1973 Hoffman was elected President and Director of the Bank.

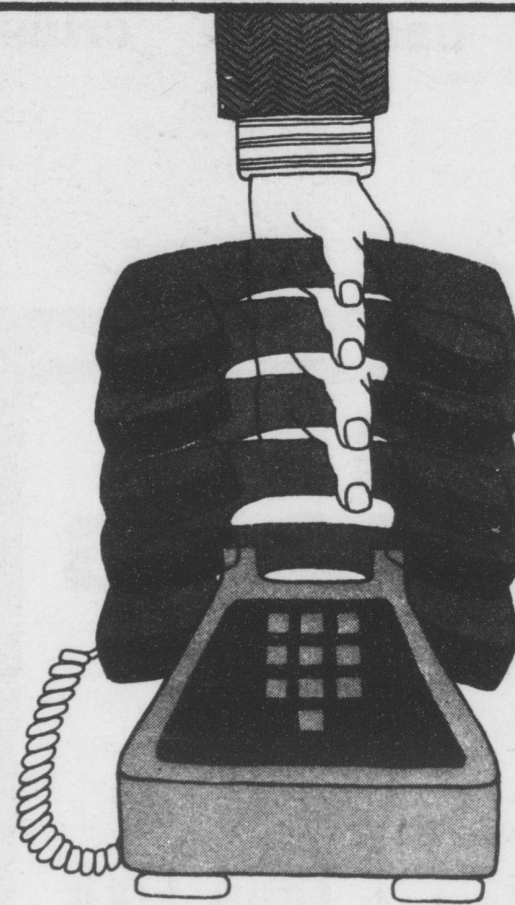
He was graduated from East Donegal Township High School and Messiah College. He has also studied with the American Institute of Banking.

Hoffman is a member of the Maytown Brethren in Christ Church.



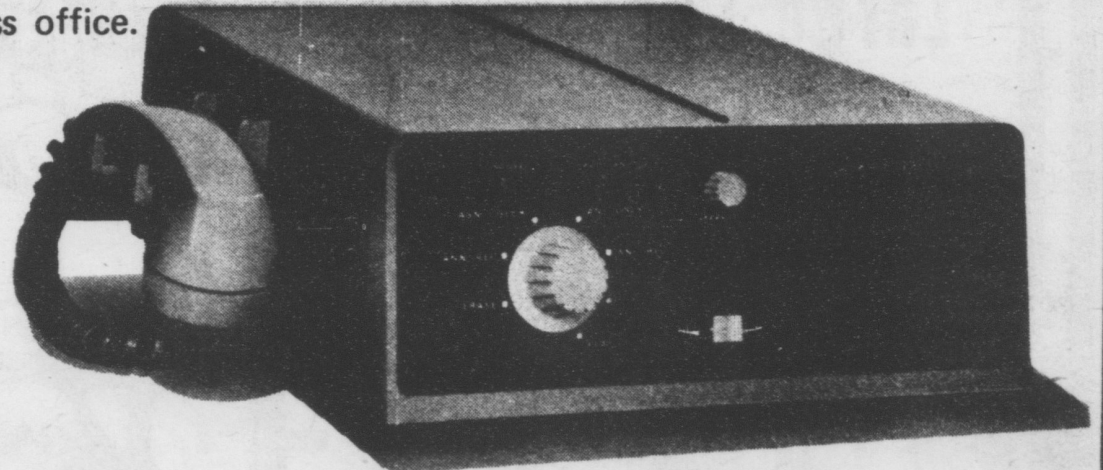
