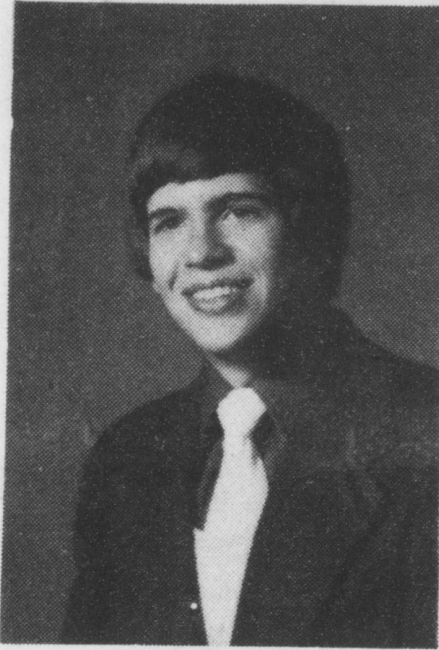


Leshner & Lauver are the boy & the girl
