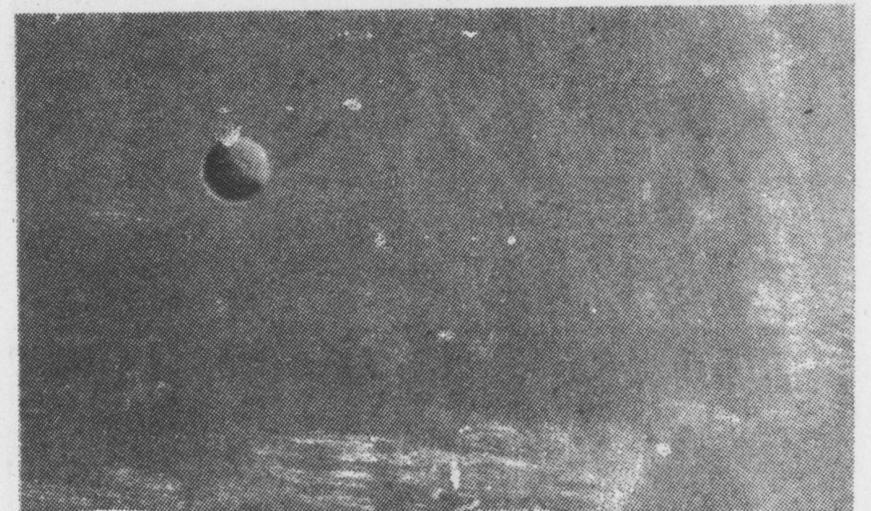
Cone Stand, by our Auxiliary, during the Marietta Fire Company Carnival, will be donated to the Fire Company.

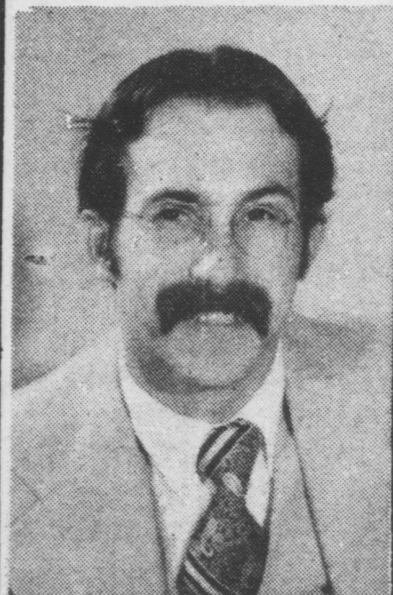
