YOUTH MUST REGISTER FOR SELECTIVE SERVICE

For the past few years all young men have been required to register with Selective Service a few days within their 18th birthdays.

The law has now been changed. No one will register during the remainder of 1975. There will be an annual registration early in 1976, the exact dates to be announced late in 1975.

Young men who registered before April 1, 1975 will not be required to register again, but the law still requires that all young men must register sometime after their 18th birthdays.

A Presidential Proclamation will announce annual registration dates in 1976.


