Flower girl was Crystal Kelly, Mt. Joy, sister of the bride. Keith Aument, Mountville, was ring bearer.

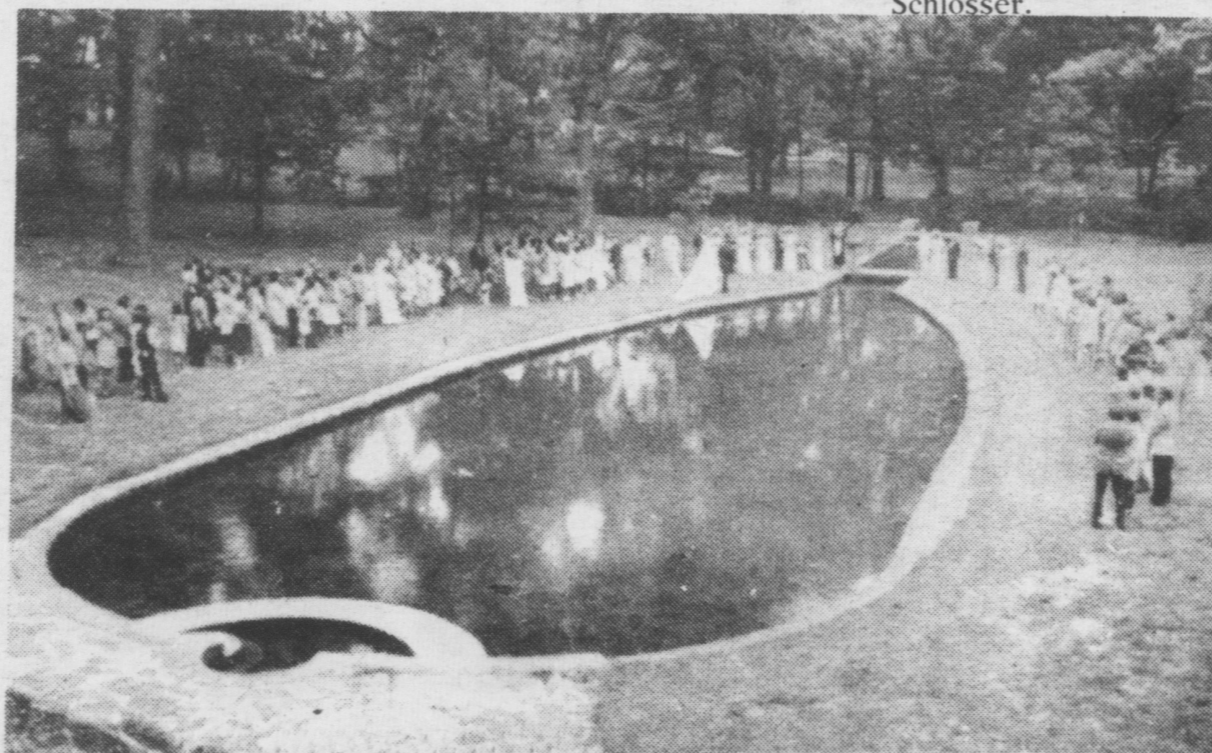
