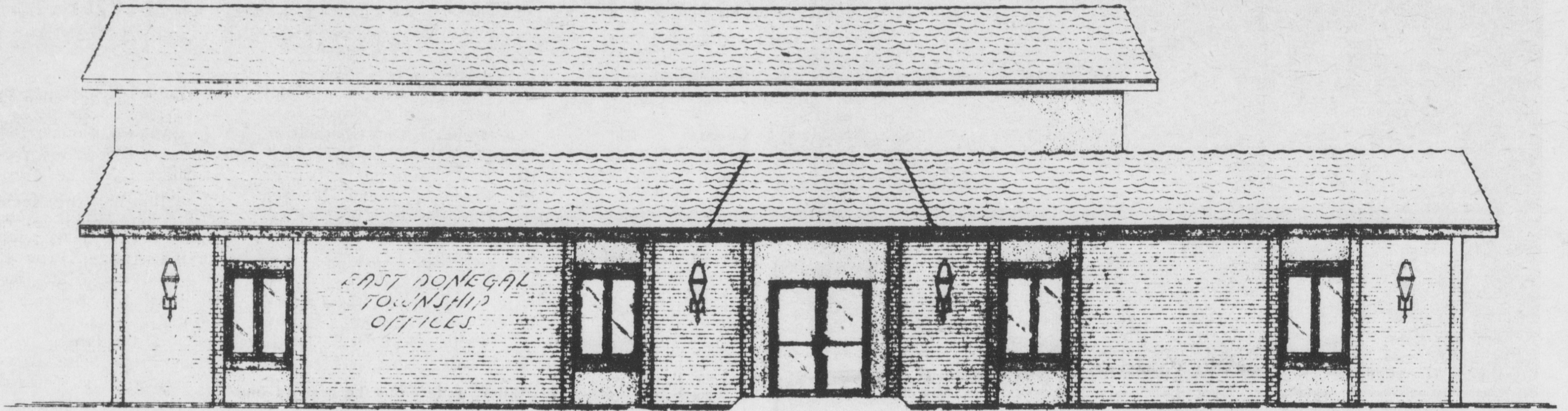


Construction of new township hall about to begin in East Donegal

Mount Joy Boro Authority weighs plan for sewage pipe to the river

At the last meeting of the Mount Joy Borough Authority, Robert Stark showed a sketch of an artist's conception of a new building for a pumping station at the two wells on the Wolgemuth property in East Donegal Township. The building is compatible with surrounding properties and buildings.

Plans for additions and alterations to the wastewater treatment plant were discussed. Summary of a study carried out an engineering firm in Harrisburg considers both the possibilities of enlarging the Chokies plant or the construction of a long outfall sewer to the Susquehanna.

Timothy Saylor, engineer,

reported that the test boring at the water standpipe site east of the borough has been completed and shows a good foundation for construction. The Authority is considering beginning construction in September.

Payment of a requisition of \$9,627.10 for engineering services for adding to and improving the water supply

and distribution systems was approved.

Also, the payment of \$2,335.80 for engineering services and lab equipment for the sewage treatment plant was approved.

Gerald Grove, representing the Donegal Fish and Conservation Association; Donald Zeller, representing the Mount Joy Sportsmen;

Henry Hackman, Lancaster County Conservation District; and Aaron Stauffer, Pennsylvania Conservation District Director, attended the public hearing and objected to the plan of building a pipeline to the Susquehanna.

They stated that a local industry has not completed plans for the construction of

a sewage treatment plant. This industry, they said, has been polluted the waters of the Little Chiques Creek in the past. Until this situation is remedied the borough authority should not proceed with plans for additions and changes in their sewage system, the conservationists said.
