

Wilson to talk at next Rotary

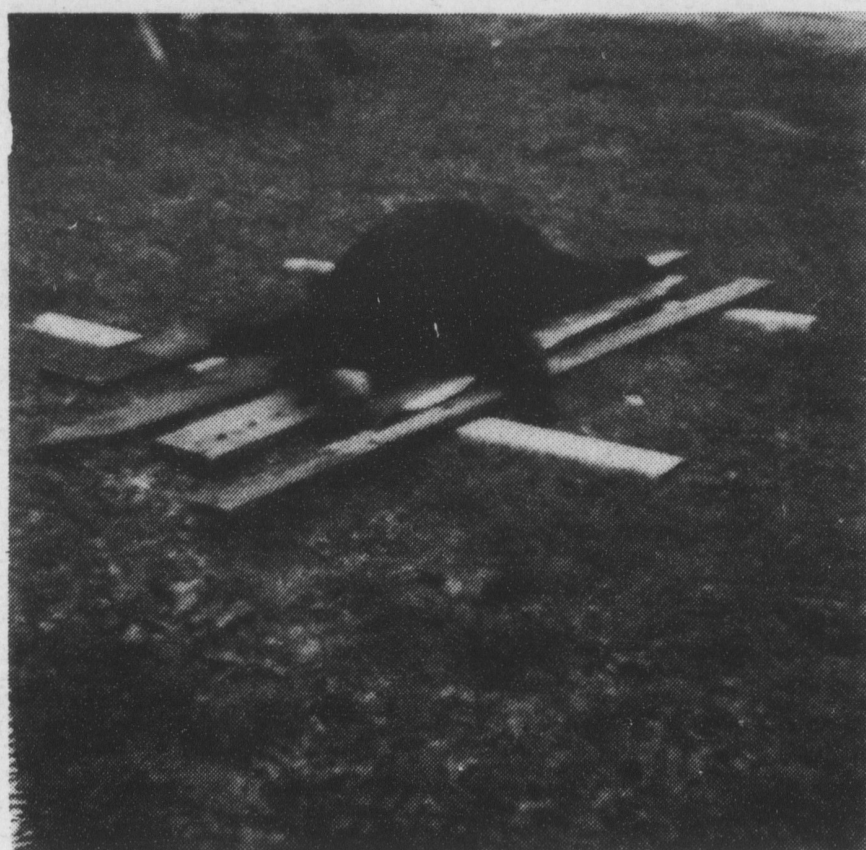

Projects will be conducted when the band members vote on the kind they prefer. Proceeds will be used to underwrite the cost on one

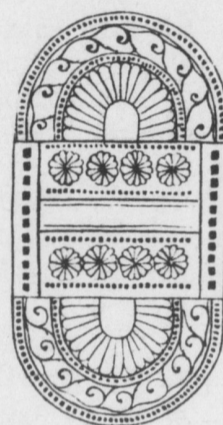
of three parades Glen Leib the director, is investigating.



A. Bube's Brewery & Catacombs,
"National Register of Historic Places"
"Registered Historical Landmark"
Well informed tour guides explain the many facets of brewing in the upper and lower levels of Lancaster County's oldest brewery. Giant vats are still in place within the Laginger Cellar. The fermented brew was placed in wooden casks in order to age for a period of 30 days before being drawn off into smaller kegs which were stored 43 feet below the street surface. Temperature remains around 50 degrees year around in the Catacombs.
