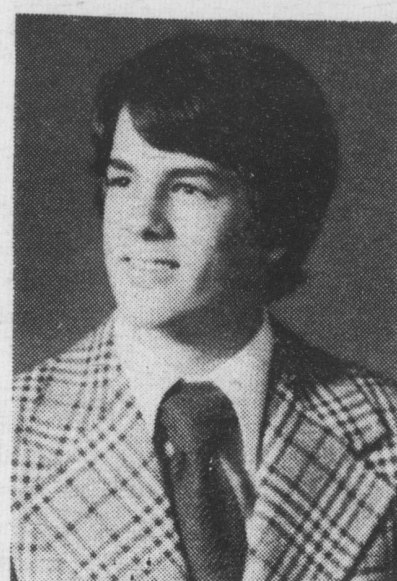


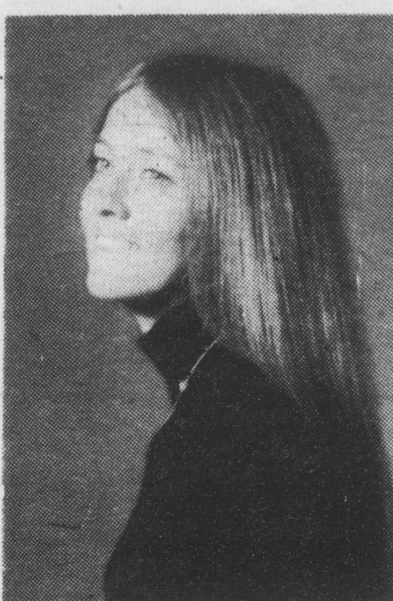
177 graduates at Donegal High School



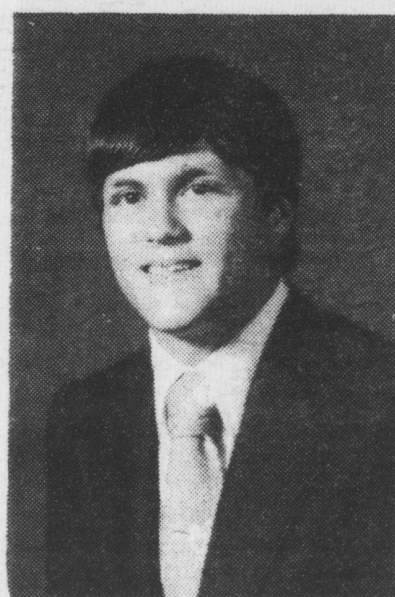

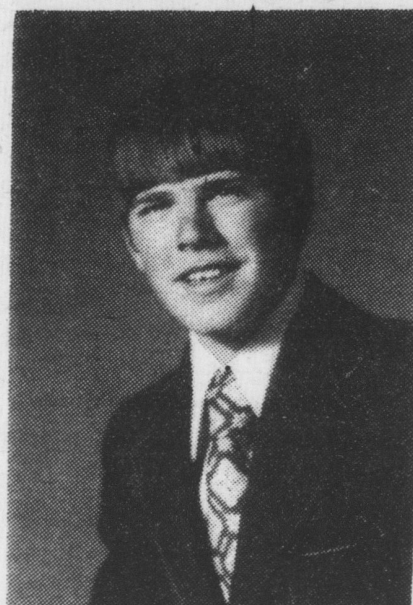

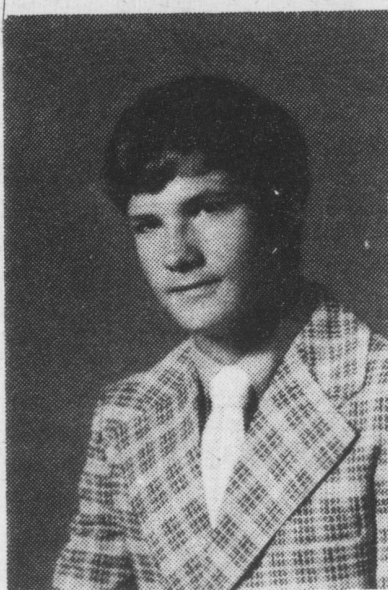
