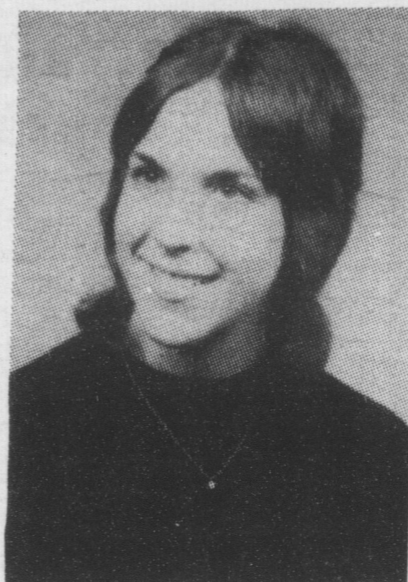
100 ARTISTS AT THE MT. GREINA CHAUTAUQUA OUTDOOR ART SHOW

The fire was caused by a gas leak with a resulting damage of \$900.00. May 22nd Friendship fulfilled a service call in Mount Joy Township to fill a swimming pool. May 24th the company stood by for the fireworks display at Mount Joy Vo-Tech School (Memorial Day Celebration). Another service call was on May 29th to fill a swimming pool in Mount Joy. A total of 43 men (an average of 21 men) responded to the 3 fire calls. The Department was in service 9 hrs. 30 min. The chief noted 34 calls for the year. Chief Good also reported a new handlight was needed and some Scott Air Packs have to be updated.
