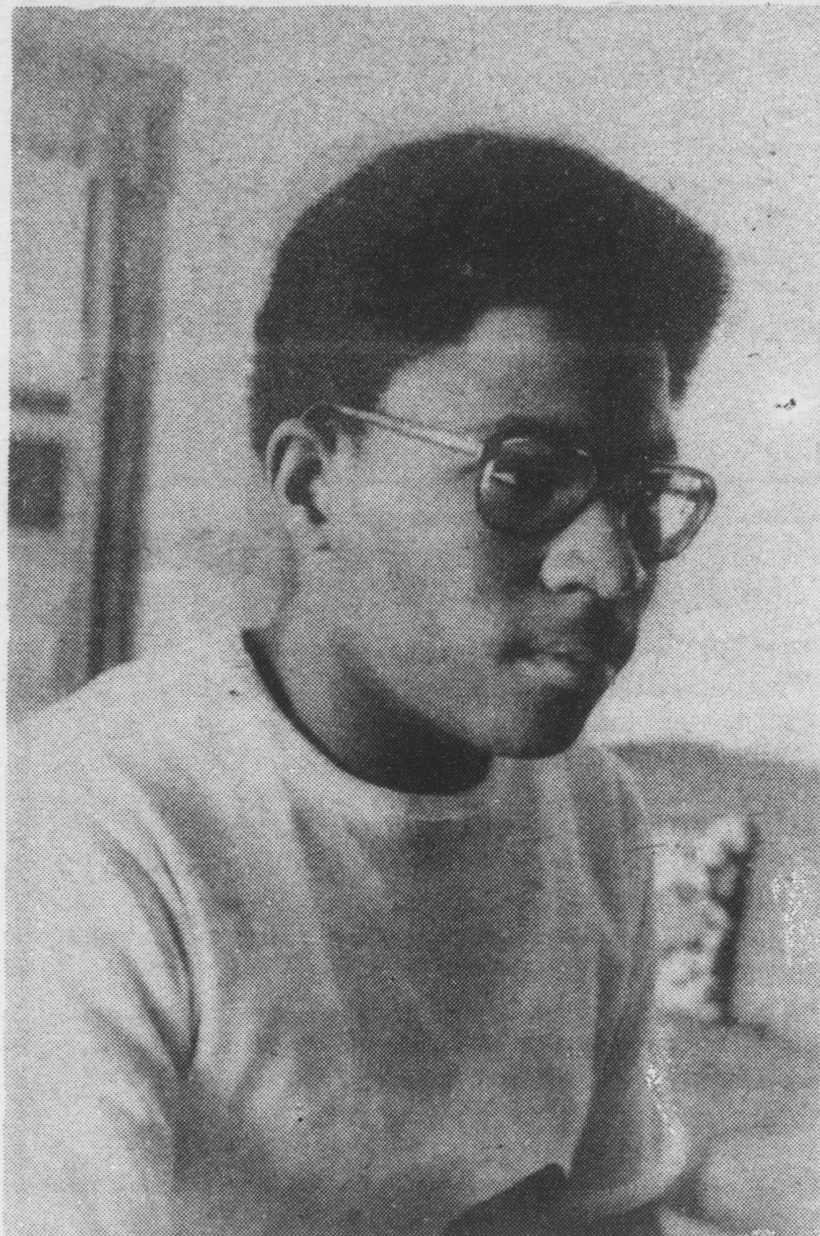


Pat Kenney III's song is recorded

Patrick Kenney III, 532 Essex Street, Marietta, has written a song, "We Searched and Found That Star," which, after a test session, has been accepted by Major Label Records, to be included in a record album, **Hit Sounds of Today**.

The album containing P. Kenney's song will be issued around Christmas of this year.

The record will be shipped to disc jockeys coast to coast radio stations, and record stores.

There is a strong possibility that the album containing Kenney's song will "break" in the Lancaster area. Kenney, a talented musician

wrote the song last fall. He plays the organ, clarinet, and saxophone, and has been accepted in the Donegal High School Band. This past year Kenney played first clarinet, second chair in the Beahm Junior High School Band.

He plays the carillon bells at English Presbyterian Church, Marietta where he was formerly a member of the youth choir, and also sings in the choir at Fairview A.M.E. Church in Marietta.

He has been on the honor roll, student council, and won first prize in the science contest at Beahm. His interests besides music are:

horsesback riding, ice and roller skating, bowling, swimming, and dancing.

Favorite classical composer: Mozart. Favorite contemporary singers: Roberta Flack, Olivia Newton John. Favorite song: "Magic," by Pilot. Favorite FM stations: Q106 and Starview.
