Local scouts attack southwest wilderness

Three Marietta - Maytown area scouts and their leaders arrived June 28, 1975 at Philmont Scout Ranch and Explorer Base in Cimarron, N.M. It is the national Boy Scouts of America 214-square mile camp in the Sangre de Cristo range of the Rocky Mountains.

The scouts, under the leadership of Issac Studholm, Marietta, spent 10 days on the trail as part of their 12-day trek at Philmont Scout Ranch and Explorer

Base. They participated in most of the programs offered in 21 staffed mountain camps. These programs include burro-packing, horseback riding, gold panning and mining, lumbering, fly tying and fishing, rock climbing, ecology, archaeology, bow-hunting, foxfire, mountain search and rescue, mountaineering, orienteering, survival, and western lore.
