Thank You, Barb Brubaker And here is Mrs. Brubaker's recipe for her cherry pie.

No-Roll Pie Crust 1½ C flour in pie pan ½ t salt in pie pan

½ C oil 2 T milk Stir oil and milk vigorously and pour over mixture of flour and salt and shape into

Cherry Filling
1 qt. home-canned semisweet cherries
1/2 C sugar

2 T corn starch
Drain cherries' juice in saucepan. Add sugar and bring to boil. Thicken with 2 T corn starch. Fold in cherries. Set aside to cool.

Crumbs for Topping
2¹/₄ C flour
1 C sugar
1 stick oleo — ¹/₄ C

1 stick oleo — ¼ C Mix together until crumbly. Fill pie shell with cherry filling. Sprinkle with desired amount of crumbs. Bake 400° F., 35—40 min. (or still bubbly).


He will be honored by a series of midget baseball games at the Park in Mount Joy, sponsored by the Mount Joy Athletic Association, headed by President Walter Gallagher.
