Tom Yatsko, Hearing Conservation Center consultant said "Most industries have recognized and are trying to control their noise problems. But there are still many other sources of noise pollution which we would like to identify.
He added that many such noise sources have not yet been surveyed. "It would be wise to learn the levels of these noises since excessively high levels can cause hearing losses" he said.
