Report those loud sounds

The Hearing Conservation Center will be conducting a study of environmental noise levels in Lancaster County beginning in August.

The center, a United Way agency, will be using portable equipment at various sites throughout the city and county to measure sound levels of recreational, transportation, and other non-occupational noises.

Any individual who knows of a particular noise source which should be included in this testing program can contact the agency office at 630 Janet Ave. Phone - 397-4741.

Tom Yatsko, Hearing Conservation Center consultant said "Most industries have recognized and are trying to control their noise problems. But there are still many other sources of noise pollution which we would like to identify."

He added that many such noise sources have not yet been surveyed. "It would be wise to learn the levels of these noises since excessively high levels can cause hearing losses" he said.
