Farm Diner; Marietta beat Chapman's Apparel; Marietta beat Chapman's Apparel.

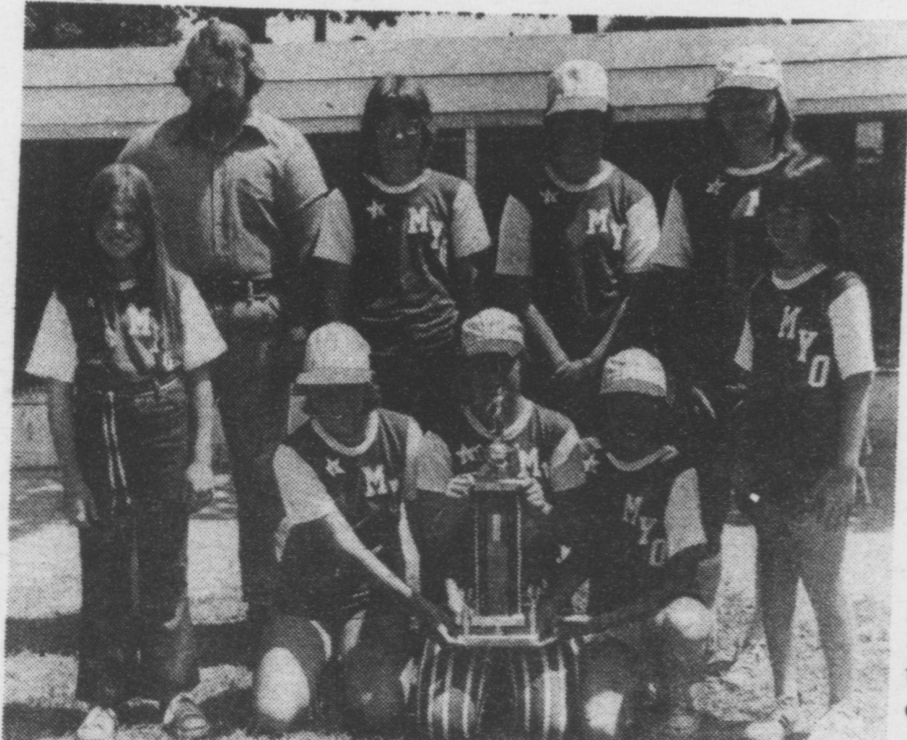
All teams played until they lost two games and were thereby eliminated.

Church of God buys Mount Joy RR. station



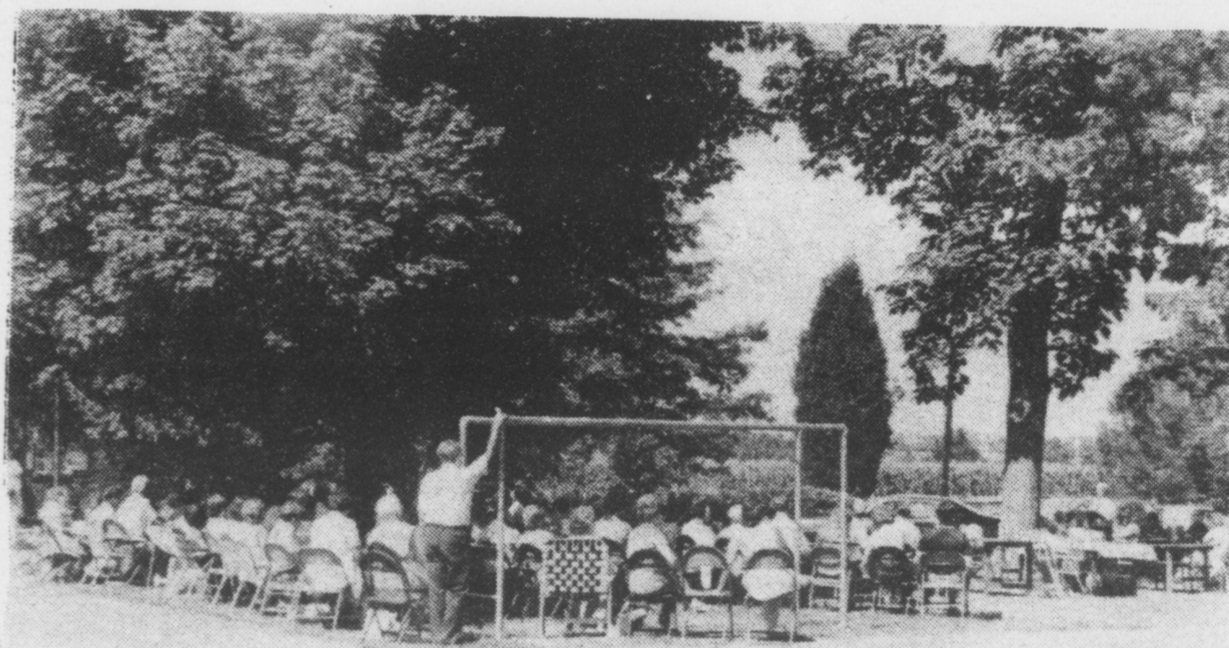
The Mount Joy Penn Central railroad station has been purchased by the Mount Joy Church of God.
