Applicants for this membership must be approved by the Ambulance Committee of the Company prior to acceptance by the Board of Officers and prior to the approval by the members of the Company. Two new members were


accepted: Horace Derr was accepted as an active member and Judy Maxwell as an emergency medical personnel. (EMP)


