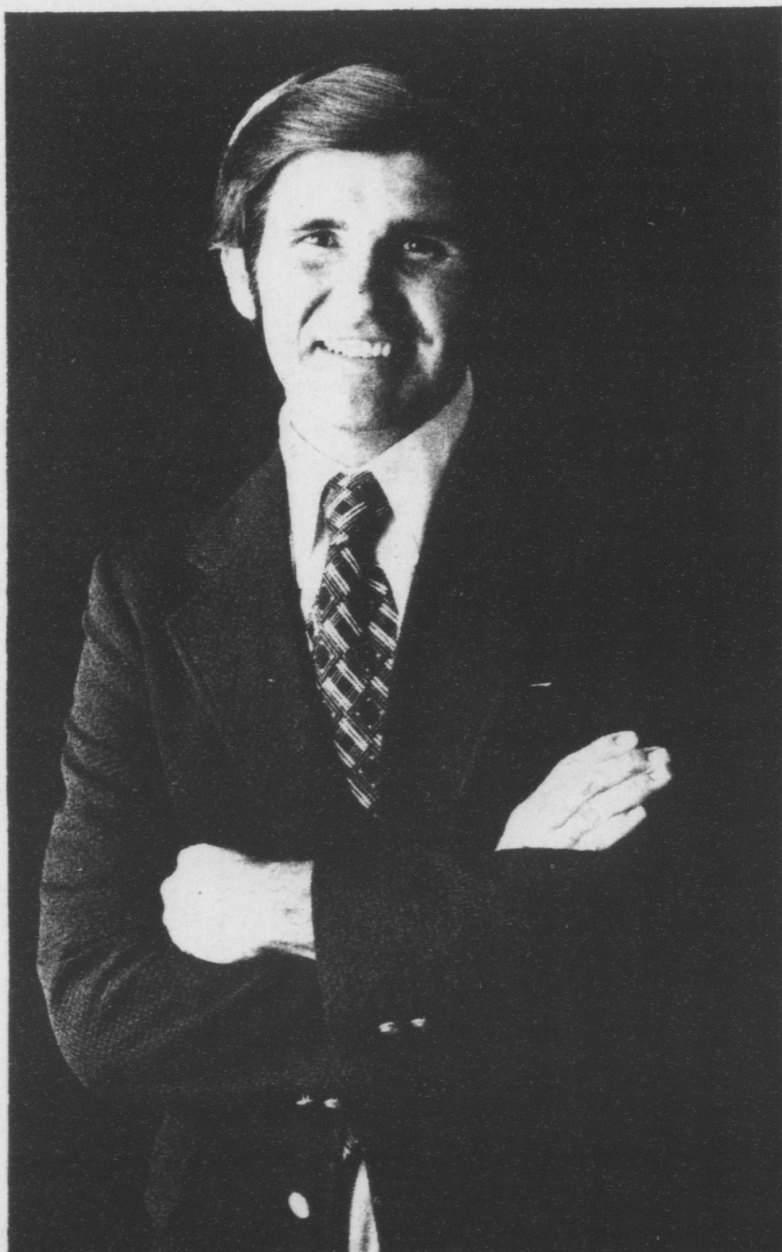
Born in East Donegal Township, he was a World War I veteran and was retired after having worked 50 years as a carpenter.
