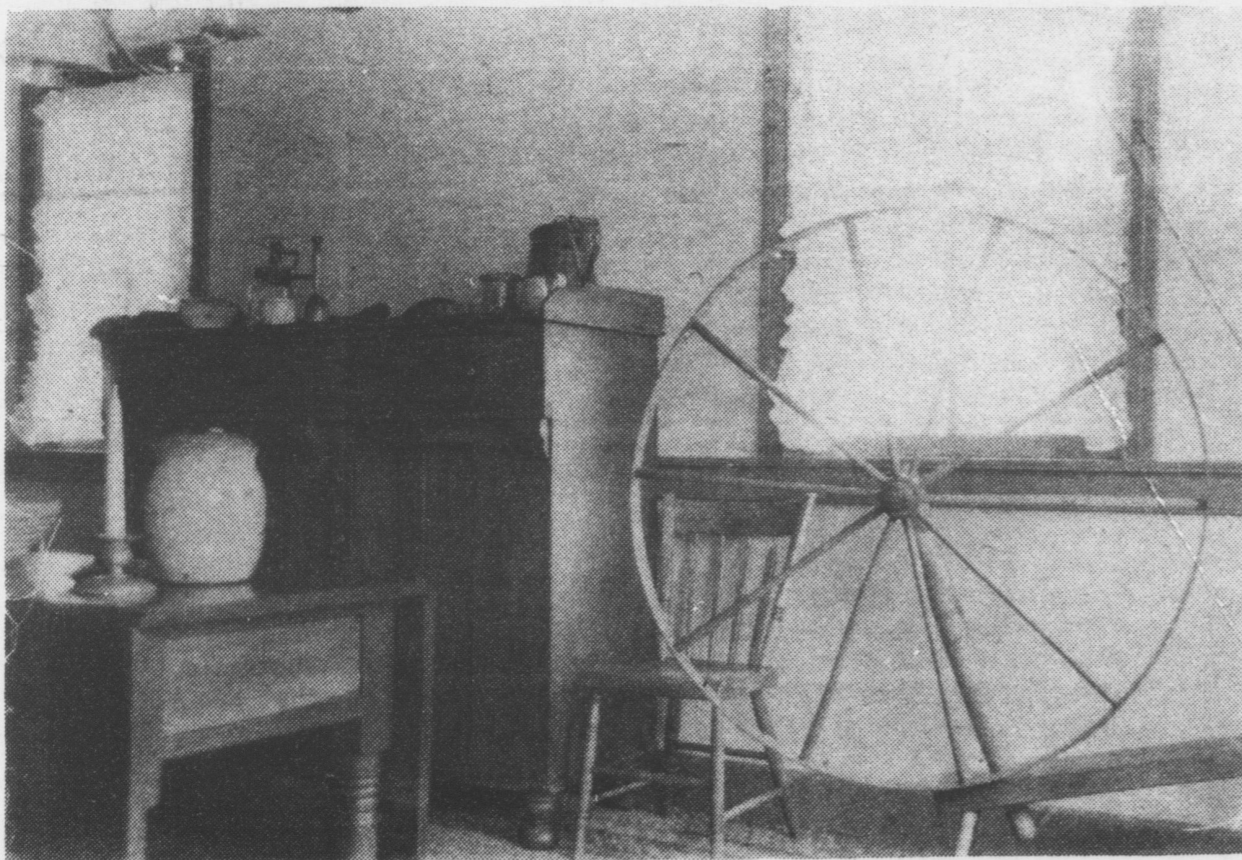
Tickets will be available at all points and a brochure will accompany each admission which includes a map designating each attraction. Tourists may start at any point on the itinerary.

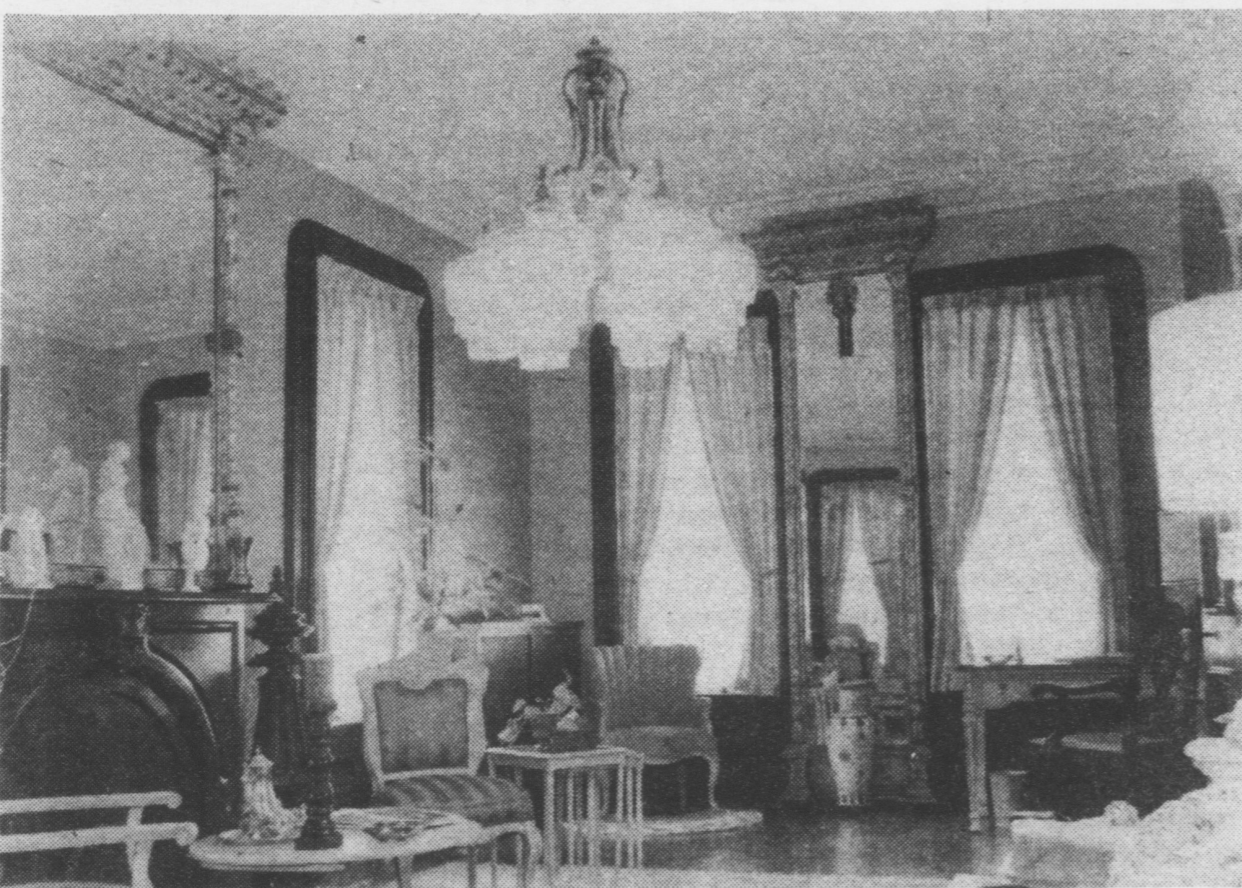
The Arnold showroom was formerly a town community center.
