# Mt. Joy plans water system additions

Butcher and Singer, investment bankers, reported last week to the Mount Joy Boro Authority on plans for improving and adding to the boro water system.

It is planned to issue bonds for the improvements next May. Work is tentatively scheduled to begin next June.

No action was taken on a proposal to erect a standpipe in Rapho Township.

AMP, Inc. requested that the water main on South Jacob Street be enlarged. The authority is requesting that their engineer investigate the feasibility of a 12 inch pipe there, feeling that a larger pipe will eventually be necessary for future residential development. AMP and the boro would share costs.

A request from Huth Engineers asking for standby water service for Rheems was not granted at this time. The authority is providing new water sites, but wishes to insure their adequacy for Mount Joy before promising water to adjacent areas.

The East Donegal Sewer Authority will be informed of Mount Joy's ability to handle sewage from Donegal High School as well as from Donegal Heights.

The East Donegal Authority will be responsible for building and maintaining the lines.


