The Junior Miss Pageant stresses poise and talent rather than beauty. There is an evening gown competition, but no bathing suit competition.

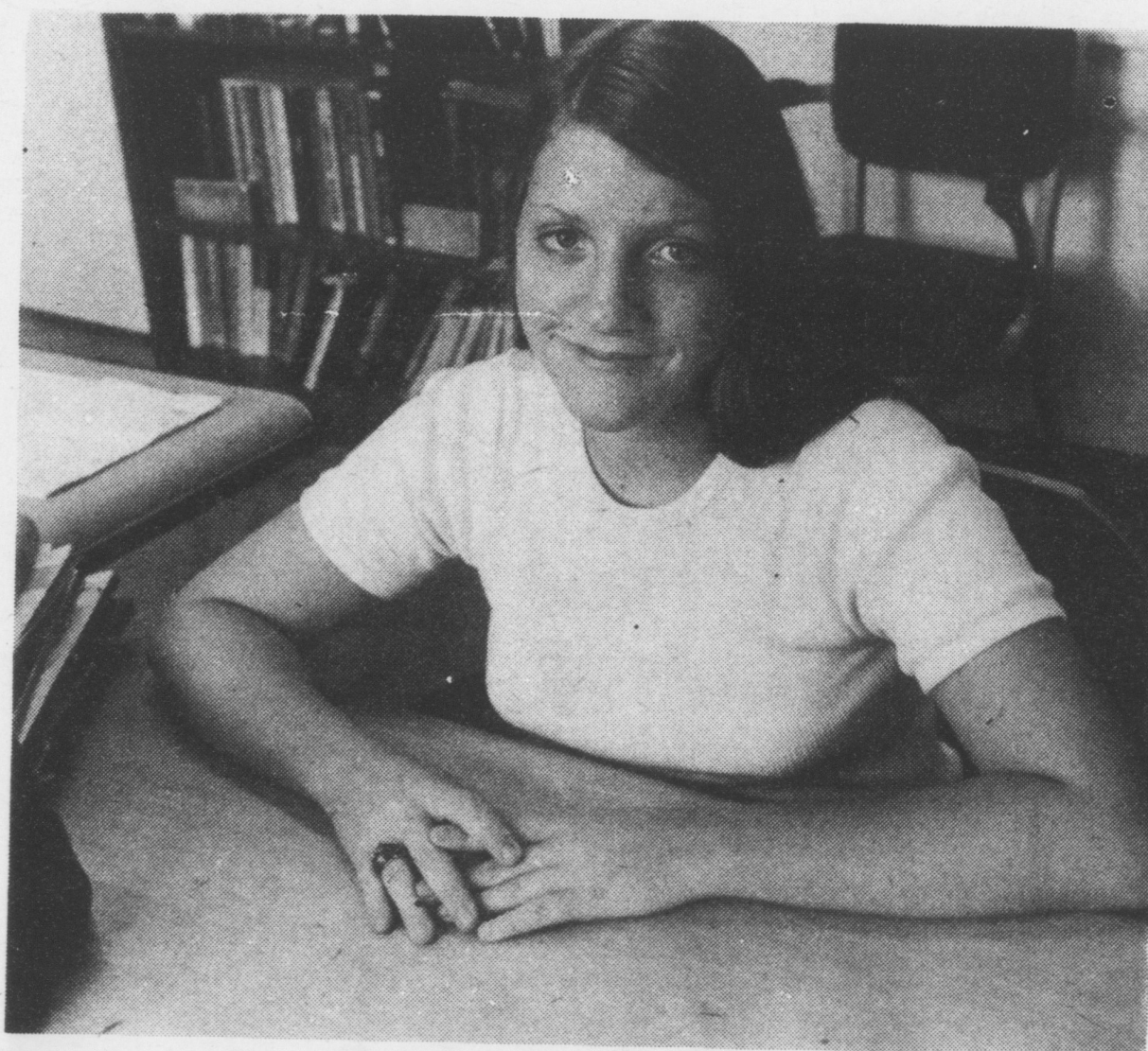
According to Melody Mumma, "It's mainly to see what kind of person you are, and if you're not a fake."
